Thank you to the PTFA who have been planning lots of activities for you all over the school year.



In return, we are asking for donations towards St James' Church's Bingo Event which is taking place on Friday 14th November.






## Sporting Events!

Good attendance at school is being here 97% of the time Pupils who arrive late and/or leave early disrupt lessons, which can be embarrassing for the child and can in turn, encourage absence. It is extremely disruptive for the rest of their class.

90% attendance means 1/2 a days absence each week; 4 weeks over the year & half a years absence over 5 years!!

At St James' Lanehead, we know that good attendance is the key to successful schooling and we believe our pupils can be amongst the best.

Attending school every day will help give your child the best possible start in life.

Going to school every day means:
