What is a DSL?

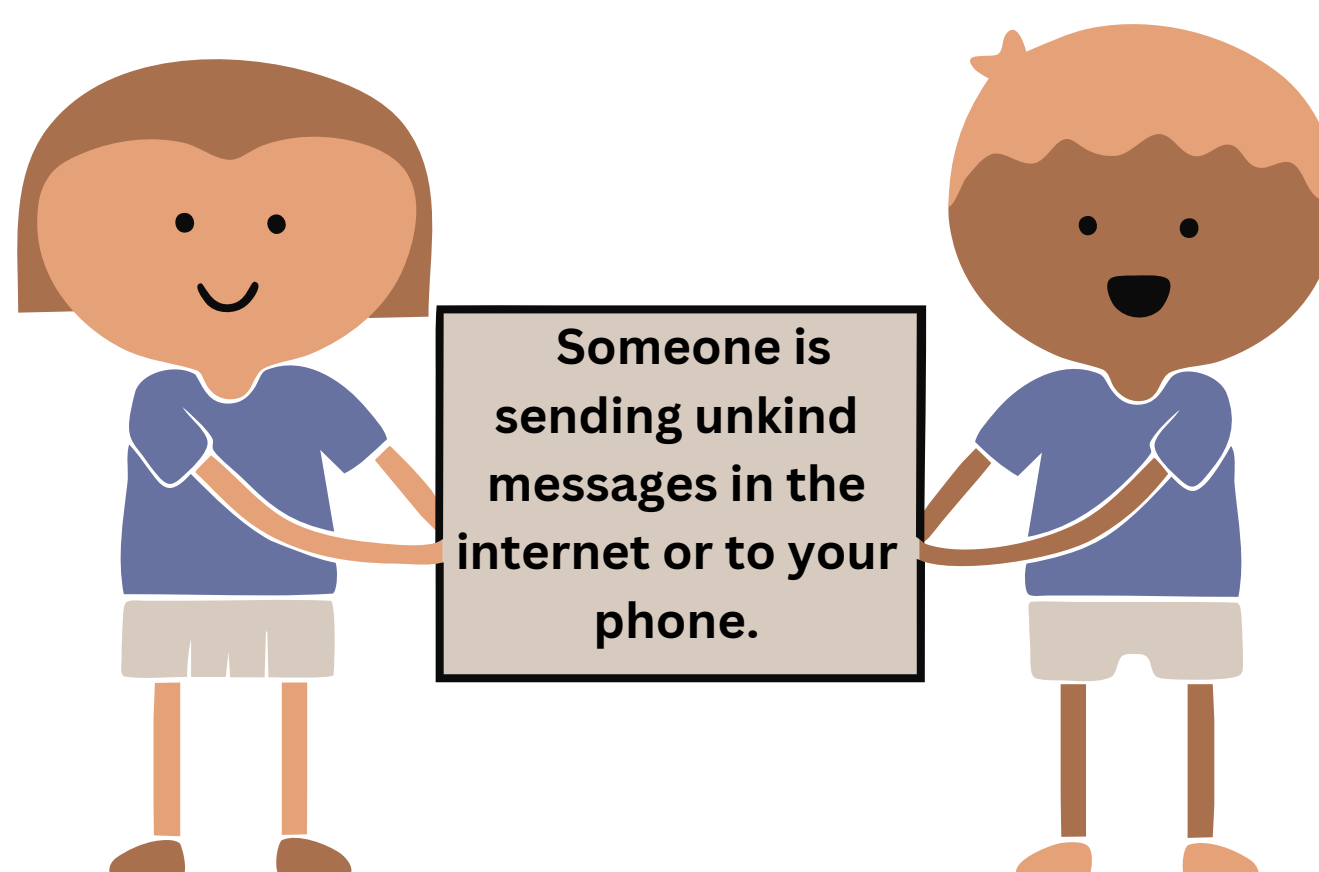
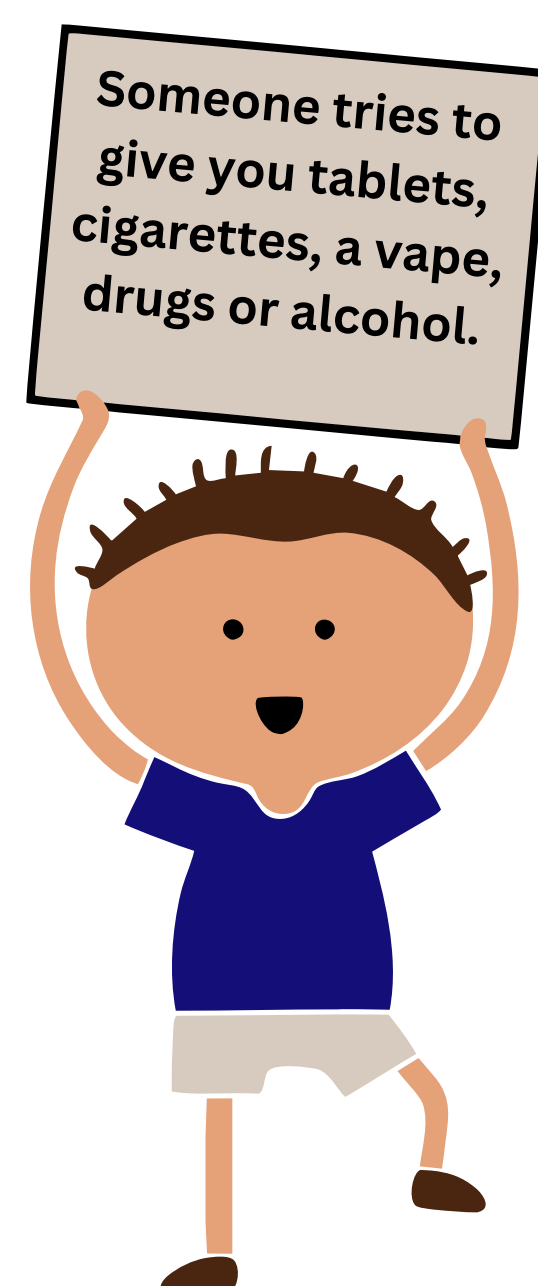
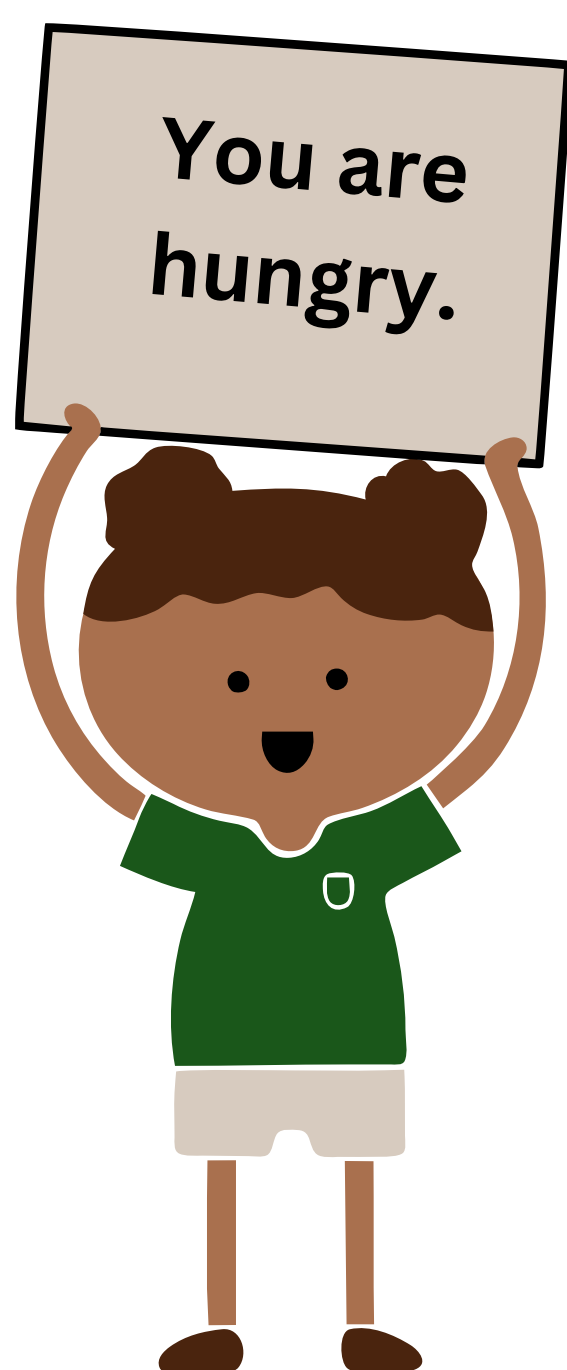
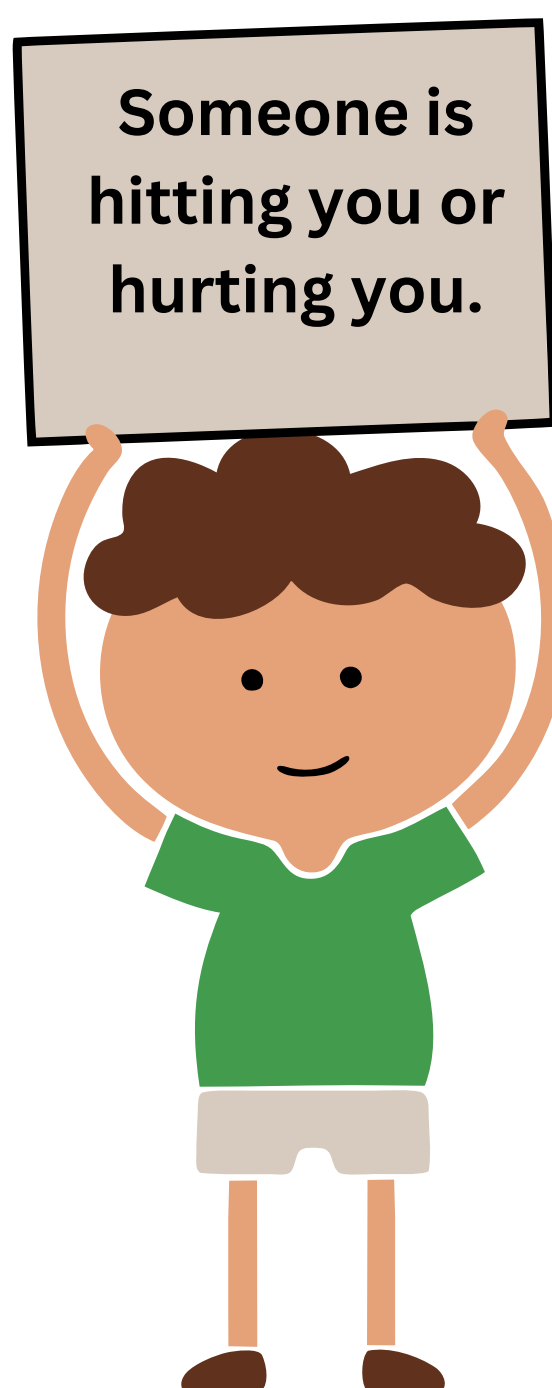
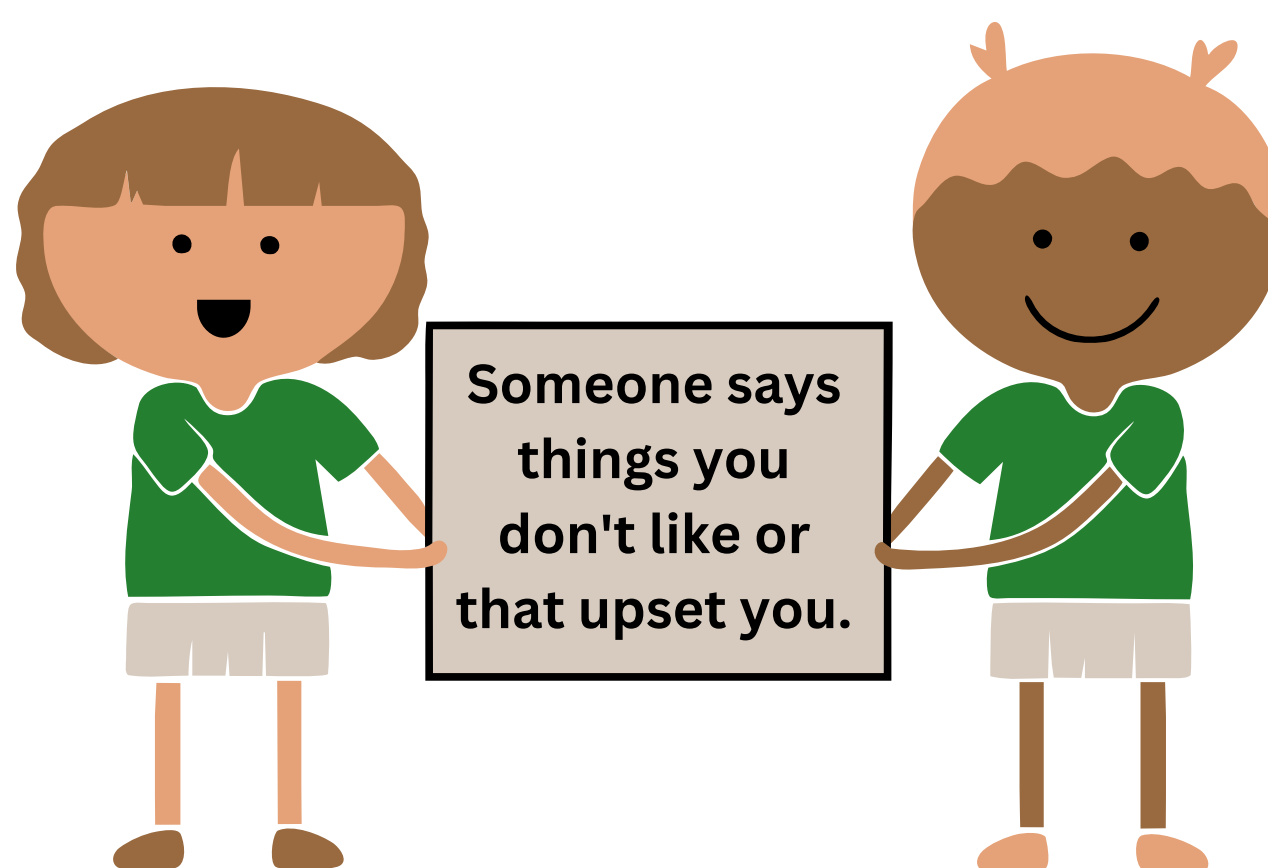
How we will try to protect you:
