Year 2 Summer 1

Science:

In Science, we will be learning about plants! We will be looking at lots of different types of plants and where they grow. As well as planning and undertaking practical investigations into how plants grow from seeds into mature plants and discussing what they need for survival.

Key knowledge:

To observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants

To find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy

To identify different types of plants and the conditions in which they grow.

Art and Design

In Art and Design, we will be learning about...

How to create observational paintings of flowers using water colours. We will develop our skills of colour mixing, tone and colour. We will research the artist Georgia O'Keeffe and be able to apply previous skills learnt in the drawing unit when sketching the flowers.

Key knowledge:

Explore <u>COLOUR</u> by recognising and naming the primary and secondary colours, and mixing secondary colours with greater confidence.

Explore lightening and darkening paint without always using black and white.

When painting flowers, understand how to use the new medium, watercolour. For this, experiment with $\overline{\text{TONE}}$ and $\overline{\text{COLOUR}}$ intensity, using a smaller brush for a more refined application.

When sketching the flowers, apply knowledge of $\underline{\mathsf{PATTERN}}$ and $\underline{\mathsf{LINE}}$ from the drawing unit.

Continue to use a sketchbook to plan, develop and record ideas. Reflect upon own artwork with greater confidence.

<u>History</u>

In History we will learn about...

... Holidays! In this unit, we will learn about holidays in the 1950s and 1960s, particularly seaside holidays. We will continue to develop our use of sources, with a particular focus on the use of oral history (from classroom visitors, friends and family) and images. They will begin to consider the use of story as a source of evidence.

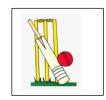
