Timetable - PE

Home Learning

In order for you to support your child with their learning, we have made our homework system as straight forward as possible...

Reading

- All children, despite their age or ability, are encouraged to read their levelled book at least **3 times per week** out loud.
- Once they have read, please make sure you **complete their reading log**, ticking for each read and signing it.
- Levelled reading books will come home weekly/fortnightly. Your child's book swap day will be a **Friday**.
- Novel reading challenge!

Maths

- Weekly homework will be set - linked to **current learning**.
- As with reading children will now have non-negotiable 5 minutes **TTRockstars 3 times a week**

Spelling

- **Level up spelling words** given each week - test every Friday
- **Weekly spelling rule** - on homework, please revise with them

Homework Club

Where children are not completing homework, they will be invited to join our homework club that will run on Friday lunch time. Teachers will be there to support the children.

Key Skills to practise at home

- Times tables – need to be fluent!
- Converting measures
 - (eg. $\text{cm} \rightarrow \text{m}$ $\text{g} \rightarrow \text{kg}$ $\text{m} \rightarrow \text{km}$)
 - Knowing that $250 = \frac{1}{4}$ $500 = \frac{1}{2}$ $750 = \frac{3}{4}$
- Telling the time (analogue and digital / 12h and 24h)
 - Wear a watch!
