Maths

We will start the term by exploring Maths in a practical way, the children will learn:

- To match, sort and compare a set of objects.
- To explore measurement and pattern.
- To explore numbers 1, 2 and 3.

Physical Development

Throughout the day and in our PE lessons the children will learn...

- To hold my pencil with a tripod grip.
- To make different types of controlled lines, from left to right.
- To move freely in different ways.
- To link movements together with control.
- To begin to move imaginatively.
- I can move using different parts of my body.

Understanding of the World

The children will learn...

To identify features of autumn (leaves falling, cooler weather, shorter days).

To identify and recall how some trees change in autumn and describe their observations.

To describe how some animals, prepare for winter

To describe the life cycles and seasonal behaviours of autumn. (hibernation, storing food, clothing).

To name different fruit and vegetables that are harvested in autumn and the role of the farmers.
