Literacy: Tidy

A text about a badger called Pete, who takes keeping the forest tidy a bit too far!

- Add the suffixes -er and -est to adjectives.
- Use subordination (if, that when, because).
- Use punctuation correctly - apostrophes for contracted forms
- Use homophones and near homophones
- Y3: Also - adverbs of time, recapping inverted commas

Maths: Y2

Fractions:

- Recognise and find a half, quarter, third, three quarters of amounts
 - Know $\frac{1}{2}$ is equal to $\frac{2}{4}$

Time:

- Tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes
- Know how many minutes are in an hour

Maths: Y3

Fractions:

- Comparing and ordering fractions (unit and non-unit)
 - Finding equivalent fractions
- Find unit and non-unit fractions of amounts

Time:

- Tell the time to the nearest minute
 - Use am and pm
 - Calculate time durations

PE - Value is Respect

Outdoor athletics: Children will be developing their skills in running, jumping, throwing and catching.

Performance dance: Children will be performing sequences of dance moves along to modern pop songs.

Art: Painting

Children will be exploring the work of Georgia O'Keefe, looking at her close up paintings of flowers. Children will be developing their skills in lightening and darkening shades without only adding black and white paint.

Music

How does music make us happy?
We will be developing our ability to find and keep a steady beat. We will explore improvisation using clapping and glockenspiels.

RE: Humanism

Geography

Children will be exploring aspects of India - including the weather and climate. We will make comparisons with our own locality.

Science: Plants

Children will be identifying and naming different parts of a plant. They will explore their functions and what ideal conditions a plant needs to grow.

Children will be learning vocabulary for fruit and vegetables in French and practising asking for different foods politely using 'Je voudrais'.
