World Book Day 2026


Our World Book Day events will be taking place on **Monday, 2nd March** on the theme "Fantastic Fairytales".

There will be a charge of £5 per pupil payable via School Spider next week.





It's been a wonderfully busy week of learning in Class Romero. Year 1 have been hard at work creating their very own China fact files in English, and they've taken such pride in showcasing what they've discovered. Continuing our China theme, our History lessons have focused on Chinese New Year, and the children were thrilled to try a prawn cracker as part of the celebration. In Science, we explored the next stage of a frog's life cycle: frogspawn. The children were fascinated—especially when they got to investigate some pretend frogspawn in class, which was delightfully gooey and messy! In DT, we've been designing our own moving vehicles, thinking carefully about how they will work. Next week, we will begin building them, complete with an axle and chassis. All in all, it's been a packed week full of curiosity, creativity, and hands-on learning. The children have embraced every moment.

Class Acutis

Another fantastic week has come to an end in Class Acutis. A highlight for me has been seeing the beautiful artwork the children have created in RE whilst learning about the healing miracles of Jesus. Many people have commented on how beautiful the work is and also how meaningful the titles are that each individual piece has been given. In maths we have continued embedding times table knowledge and Year 2 are roaring ahead with the 5x table. Year 3 and Year 4 have had some difficult concepts to grapple with and have realised how useful it is to have rapid recall of key number facts. We have started our new text in English – The Firework-Maker's Daughter. The setting from a different culture has really grabbed the children's interest and they have produced some very descriptive writing of the main character Lila. In science I set the children a challenge to find out about what is inside a lightbulb after learning about Thomas Edison's work on inventing a lightbulb – is bamboo still used?

In spellings, we are a week behind the grid that has been sent out via School Spider.

Class Kolbe

We've had a fun and productive week in Class Kolbe, with lots of exciting learning taking place across the curriculum. In RE, the children have been learning about Jesus' miracles, exploring the stories in detail and discussing the important messages and meanings behind them. In science, we investigated the impact of exercise on the circulatory system. The children were very engaged and enjoyed learning how physical activity affects the heart and blood flow. In maths, Year 6 have been focusing on ratio, working hard to develop their understanding through a range of problem-solving activities. Year 5 have continued their learning on fractions, showing great perseverance and progress. In English, the children have been thoroughly enjoying our class text Beowulf. They produced some fantastic diary entries, writing from the perspective of Beowulf whilst demonstrating creativity and thoughtful language choices. Well done to all the children for their enthusiasm and effort this week.


