



A Scientist's Knowledge Organiser:

- To know that **friction** is a force between two surfaces that are **sliding**, or trying to slide, across each other.
- To know that **air resistance (drag)** is friction between a **moving object** and the **air** around it.
- To know that **water resistance** is friction between a **moving object** and the **water** around it.






A Historian's Knowledge Organiser:

An Artist's Knowledge Organiser:

- To know that shading is used to show form – make something look 3 dimensional.
- To know that a tonal bar shows a range of tones and is created by gradually increasing the pressure on the pencil.
- To know the different elements of creating form – highlight (where the light directly hits an object); core shadow – the darkest area where no light can reach); mid-tones (gradually darkening tones from the highlight to the core shadow); cast shadow (where a shadow is created on a surface); reflected light (where light hits the surface and is reflected back onto the object).



An Athlete's Knowledge Organiser:

A Designer's Knowledge Organiser:
