Extend the range of sentences with more than one clause by using a wider range of conjunctions, including when, if, because, although;

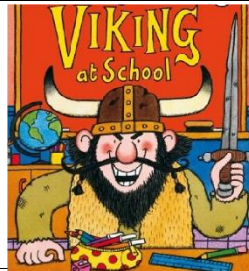
Use conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time and cause
