Plan their writing by:

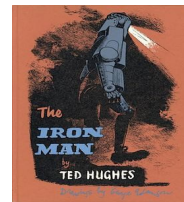
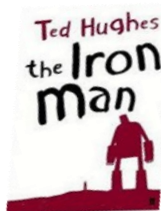
- discussing writing similar to that which they are planning to write in order to understand and learn from its structure, vocabulary and grammar
