English

We start with our Lancashire English unit called Family Album. We will read many traditional tales throughout the unit. Our focused text is an unfamiliar traditional tale called 'Diamonds and Toads' by Charles Perrault. The children will retell the tale using a story map. They will then make their own changes to the characters and events in the story. Then, they will write their own version of the story. After that, we will use familiar family events to re-tell and write recounts of birthday parties.



Maths

We will begin this half term focusing on number and place value up to 100. Following on from that, we will measure and record mass using 1g and 10g. Next, we will consolidate 2-D and 3D shapes including sorting them into criteria. Then, we will learn about coins up to £2 and notes including adding the cost of items and using the correct coins to pay. Finally, we will learn to count confidently in 2s, 5s and 10s and use this to help us complete multiplication and division calculations or problems.



Reading

Please read and make a record every time your child reads at home. Your child's book will be changed on their reading day. If you would like to know the day your child reads, please ask one of the Year 1 team.

Recommended Reading Sequence

- First read- your child reads one book to decode and apply their phonic knowledge to read new, unfamiliar words. Parents can read parts of the book too to help.
- Second read- re-read the same book. Your child should be able to read this more smoothly and confidently to develop a better understanding of the book.
- Repeat with your child's second book.

Science

In Science, we will be learning about humans. The children have asked some great questions about what they want to learn. Over the half term, we will identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body including which part is associated with each sense. The children will recognise that humans are animals. They will compare and describe differences in their own features such as eyes, hair, skin colour etc and that humans also have many similarities.



Topic Art and History



We have started our new Art topic this week. We will be learning about two significant artists, Pablo Picasso and Andy Warhol. We will observe and compare their artwork across different periods in time. Then, we will use the styles of Picasso and Warhol to draw our own portraits using the media of oil pastels and digital apps.



Geography

Where are the UK's Unicorns, Dragons, Lions and Giants?

This half term, we will learn about and read stories about the mythical creatures associated with each country of the United Kingdom. Through this, the children will learn about the United Kingdom, the four countries, capital cities, famous landmarks and surrounding seas.
