We were lucky to welcome visitors who help us in our community this week. Molly-Ann and Mia from the dentist taught us lots of facts about teeth and showed us how to brush our teeth correctly. Moly-Ann and Mia talked about how they help people keep their teeth healthy. On Thursday, Dr Keens ran a Teddy Bears' Clinic, where the children diagnosed and treated their teddies using real equipment, including stethoscopes, otoscopes and pulse oximeters. Maths – Composition

In Maths, we have continued to explore the composition of numbers, extending our learning to 7. The children used double die frames to represent numbers in different ways, for example: 3 and 3 make 6, 5 and 1 make 6, and 6 and 1 make 7.

We introduced our Rainbow Challenges this week — independent challenges linked to our learning. The children have been very excited to take part and have shown an excellent attitude towards their learning.
