




Mr Price's Year 5 Takeaway Homework Summer 1 2026

Use a clear title, a main image and at least three "sell lines".</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>Gestation Investigation: Research and compare the gestation periods of three different animals. Present your findings in a table, a bar chart or an information page.</p>	<p>Geography</p> <p>UK Landmarks: Create a travel poster for one of the UK's mountain ranges or major rivers. Include its location, its height or length and one interesting physical feature.</p>
<p>Art</p> <p>Animal Forms: Using Plasticine, clay or recycled materials, create a 3D model of a British animal. Focus on adding texture to the surface to make it look realistic.</p>	<p>English / British Culture</p> <p>Read and enjoy The Beatles comprehension and answer the questions.</p> 	<p>History</p> <p>Victorian Innovation: Research one invention from the Victorian era (like the telephone or steam engine). Write a short paragraph explaining who invented it and how it changed daily life.</p>	<p>RE</p> <p>The Night of Power: Create an informative fact file about the Qur'an. Explain why the "Night of Power" is significant to Muslims and how the holy book is treated with respect.</p>
<p>French</p> <p>Family Tree: Create a French Family Tree (<i>Ma Famille</i>). Label at least five family members using the correct possessive adjectives (e.g., <i>mon père</i>, <i>ma sœur</i>).</p>	<p>Maths (Geometry focus)</p> <p>Angle Hunter: Use a protractor to measure three different angles you can find at home (e.g., the corner of a table or an open door). Accurately measure them, then label them as acute, obtuse or reflex.</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>Use the free MathsBot website to practise your KS2 arithmetic skills. The easiest way is to Google "MathsBot arithmetic Year 5" (or choose a lower year group if you would like extra practice at a different level of challenge).</p>	<p>DT / Music</p> <p>Listen to the song "Yellow Submarine" by The Beatles. As you listen, imagine you are the inventor of this magical British vehicle. Draw a detailed cross-section of the submarine.</p>
