Answer the following questions: • How long do you spend in lessons? • How long do you spend sleeping? • How long do you spend playing? Show your working for your answers. 	Art This half-term, we will be practising our sculpting skills to create a model tree using papier mache and tin foil. Create a 3D model using any form of media. Please take a picture of what you create and glue this into your homework book.
