## Reading

We will be reassessing reading this half term and moving those on scheme books on, if possible. Please make sure that you send books in every day - we have independent reading slots across the week and readers are heard by adults on a Monday and Thursday. Please continue to **Strive for 5!** each week - trying to read at least 5 times a week at home! This will really improve your child's reading. Books will be checked on a Monday for this.

## Homework

Children will be set spellings, times tables and Maths homework as they were last term. These link to learning that is taking place within class. Spelling tests will be on **Monday**, times tables on a **Thursday** and maths homework goes out on a **Thursday**, due in on a **Wednesday**. Please make sure these are in on time so that they can be marked and sent out again.

## English

Our first text we will be reading is called Big Blue Whale, by Nicola Davies, where our final outcome will be writing a persuasive informative article about whales for the protection of the blue whale. We will be learning about using persuasive language and the key features of non-fiction writing.

## Science

Our science topic is Sound, when we will be identifying how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating, recognising that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear, and recognise that sounds become fainter as the distance from the sound source increases. We will be learning about how to make a fair test.

## Religious Education

In RE this term, we will be looking at why Christians believe that Jesus is the Son of God, and how they believe that he was both human and divine. We will also look at the importance of the Sabbath to Jews. We will then look at the Easter story and ask if it is a story of trust or betrayal.

## History and Geography

This term our History theme is based on Ancient Greece - a study of Greek life & achievements and their influence on the western world. In Geography we will be looking at the major cities around the world and locating them on maps and in atlases, under the theme of All Around the World.

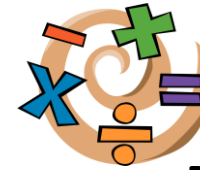

## Science **Sound**

Identify how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating  
Recognise that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear

Find patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that produced it, as well as between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it

Recognise that sounds become fainter as the distance from the sound source increases

Start to make their own decisions about the most appropriate type of scientific enquiry they might use to answer questions, e.g. recognising when a fair test is necessary
