

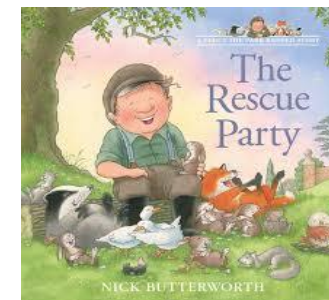
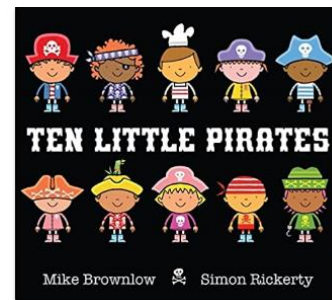

	WRITING	✓ Sequence sentences to form short narratives ✓ Re read what they have written to check it makes sense ✓ Join words and joining clauses using ‘and’ and ‘because’ ✓ Use capital letter for peoples names, places, days of the week and ‘I’ ✓ Handwriting – form capital letters ✓ Begin to punctuate sentences using a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark.
