

Year 1 Home Learning Spring 1

This half term, children are invited to complete a range of home learning tasks linked to the curriculum and the learning taking place in class. While you are welcome to complete as many tasks as you like, we ask that you complete at least three tasks across different subjects, for example, one English, one Maths, and one from another area of the curriculum.

Home learning is due in on Wednesday 11th February 2026, when children will have the opportunity to share their work with peers and teachers across the year group and receive feedback.

Tasks can be completed in home learning exercise books or in any format you prefer.

Draw a picture to help your reader.</p>	 <p>Hopscotch Maths Draw a number line on the floor or outside with chalk (1–20). Hop to two numbers and either add or subtract them. Say the answer out loud and then write it down.</p>	 <p>RE - Hinduism: Important Life Events Choose a Hindu festival (e.g., Diwali) Draw a picture of the festival. Write 2–3 sentences about why it is important.</p>
 <p>Describing Winter Look out of your window. Write 2–3 sentences to describe winter. Use at least one adjective (describing word).</p>	 <p>Number Snap Players take turns turning over the top card and placing it in the middle. When two cards of the same number appear on top of the pile, the first player to shout "Snap!" wins the pile. Keep playing until one player has all the cards or until you want to stop.</p>	 <p>PSHE - Dreams and Goals Draw a picture of something you want to achieve (e.g. cursive handwriting). Write 1–2 sentences about how you will reach your goal.</p>
