




Year 1 Home Learning Spring 2

This half term, children are invited to complete a range of home learning tasks linked to the curriculum and the learning taking place in class. While you are welcome to complete as many tasks as you like, we ask that you complete at least three tasks across different subjects, for example, one English, one Maths, and one from another area of the curriculum.

Home learning is due in on Wednesday 18th March 2026, when children will have the opportunity to share their work with peers and teachers across the year group and receive feedback.

Tasks can be completed in home learning exercise books or in any format you prefer.

 <p>Story Retell – Max’s Adventure</p> <p>Draw three pictures to show the beginning, middle and end of Max’s adventure. Write one sentence for each picture to retell what happened.</p>		<p>Build the Number</p> <p>Choose a number between 10 and 50. Show it using tens and ones (e.g. draw sticks and dots). Write how many tens and ones it has and the matching number sentence.</p>		<p>Science - Plants</p> <p>Look at a plant in your home or garden. Draw and label the roots, stem, leaves and flower (if it has one). Write 2–3 sentences explaining what a plant needs to grow and stay healthy.</p>	
 <p>A New Wild Thing</p> <p>Imagine a new Wild Thing visits Max. What does it look like? What does it do? Draw a picture and write 3–4 sentences to retell part of the story with your new character included.</p>		<p>Mystery Number</p> <p>I have 4 tens and 7 ones. What number am I?</p> <p>Make three more mystery numbers for someone at home to solve.</p>		<p>History - How Toys Have Changed</p> <p>Ask an adult about a toy they played with when they were little. Draw their toy and one of your toys. Write sentences to explain how the toys are the same and how they are different.</p>	
 <p>All about Wild Things</p> <p>Write 3–4 facts about Wild Things. What do they look like? What can they do? Where do they live? Remember capital letters and full stops.</p>		<p>Measurement - Longer or Shorter?</p> <p>Find three objects at home. Measure them using cubes or a ruler. Which is the longest? Which is the shortest? Put them in order from shortest to longest</p>		<p>Art - Leaf Collage</p> <p>Go outside and collect different leaves. Use paper and glue to stick them down and make a picture or pattern. You can add colours.</p>	
 <p>How to Tame a Wild Thing</p> <p>Write simple instructions to explain how Max became king of the Wild Things. Use numbers (1, 2, 3) and bossy verbs like <i>look</i>, <i>say</i>, <i>roar</i>.</p>		<p>Estimate and Measure</p> <p>Choose a range of objects. First, estimate how long it is. Then measure it using centimetres or cubes. Was your estimate close? Write the measurement.</p>		<p>PSHE - Healthy Me</p> <p>Draw a picture of yourself doing your favourite physical activity. Write sentences explaining how exercise keeps your body and mind healthy.</p>
