










# Year 2 Home Learning Summer 2



This half term, children are invited to complete a range of home learning tasks linked to the curriculum and the learning taking place in class. While you are welcome to complete as many tasks as you like, we ask that you complete **at least three tasks** across different subjects, for example, one English, one Maths, and one from another area of the curriculum.

Please ensure all home learning is completed by **Monday 6th July** in preparation for our end of year Home Learning Showcase. A specific date will be shared shortly via school spider, when parents and carers will be invited into school to view and celebrate the children's home learning. Tasks can be completed in home learning exercise books or in any format you prefer.

	<p><b>Letter Writing</b> Write a letter to your teacher or friend at school about something special, exciting or interesting that you have been involved in. Make sure you describe what happened with interesting adjectives.</p>		<p><b>Tally Chart Hunt!</b> Become a maths detective and create your own tally chart at home. <b>Your Challenge</b> Choose something to count and record it using tally marks. E.g. You could count: <b>fruits or vegetables</b> you have eaten in the week</p>	<p><b>History School in the past</b></p> 	<p>Ask your parents, carers and grandparents to describe their experiences at school and compare it to your time at Whitchurch Primary.  What is the <b>same</b> and what is <b>different</b>?</p>
	<p><b>Vocabulary Work:</b> Pick 5 objects around your home and use <b>Expanded Noun Phrases</b> to describe them in a sentence. e.g. ...the <b>large, soft, velvet sofa</b> by the window</p>	<p>Reading Thermometers</p> 	<p><b>Measure - Temperature Tracker Challenge</b> Check the temperatures in different places at home. Ideas: outside, fridge, bedroom, sunny window Which was <b>warmest</b>? Which was <b>coldest</b>? Draw a thermometer picture to show your findings.</p>	<p><b>Art London Landmarks</b></p> 	<p>List 3 of your favourite famous London Landmarks. Pick one and sketch it with as much detail as you can and then colour it.  Write down <b>why</b> it is your favourite London landmark.</p>

## Creative Curriculum Project

This term in History, we are exploring the question: How was school different in the past?

For your home learning project, choose one of the following:

- **Mini Museum Box**  
Decorate a shoebox and fill it with objects or pictures showing an old-fashioned classroom. E.g Chalk, old school uniforms
- **Split Poster: Past vs Present**  
Fold a large sheet in half. One side: School in the past; Other side: School today
- **A Day in an Old-Fashioned School: Create a diary entry** pretending to be a child at school 100 years ago.  
Include:  
What they wore  
What lessons they learned  
What happened if they were naughty  
Playground games  
How they travelled to school  
Add drawings around the writing.
