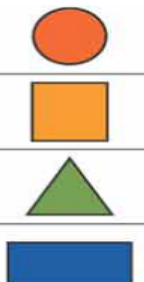
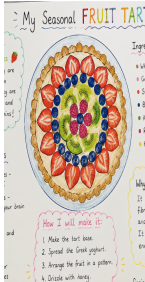
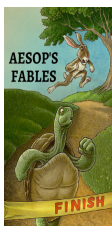
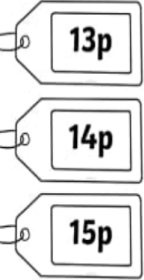


Year 3 Home Learning Autumn 1
