What will we be learning about this term in LKS2?

English:

In English, the children will use a variety of different stimulus throughout the term to engage and inspire the children's writing. The children will begin the term looking at story The Lion & The Unicorn and cover a range of writing such as setting descriptions, historical stories, letters and poetry. Children will also focus on spelling, punctuation, and grammar.

RE

Children will to learn how celebrating Passover help Jews show God they value their special relationship with Him.

French:

Children will learn key vocabulary and phases for places in a town.
They will also learn about articles and determiners.

PSHE:

In PHSE, children will look at Acceptance and Responsibility. The children will focus on Growth and Change as well as looking at Physical and Mental Health and the impact of these on ourselves. Children will also study the importance of our school values.

Science:

Children will learn about the differences between solids, liquids and gases, classifying objects and identifying their properties. They will then explore in-depth how water changes state, exploring melting, freezing, condensing as well as a particular focus on evaporation.

Design Technology:

Children will use their knowledge of levers and linkages to design and make a moving celebration card.

Art:

Children will study the expressionist artists Jackson Pollock and Wassily Kandinsky and use their style to create their own artwork.

Maths:

In Maths, children will be studying the topics: Multiplication & Division focusing on multiples of 3, 6, 9. We will then be looking at formal written methods of multiplication and division.

We will also focus on mental arithmetic and Times Tables.

PE

Indoor – children will learn a range of multi skills.

After February half term, the children will also receive Rugby training by Warrington Wolves Coaches.

Geography:

How Has Warrington Changed? In this topic, the children will take a look at the geography of Warrington – from the physical features to the manmade landmarks that are synonymous with Warrington. They will find out how the landscape has changed over time; how the city has grown and how the population has changed throughout the course of history.

History:
