A MESSAGE FROM MR LAVIN... This term seems to be flying by! I hope you have had a lovely week! It has been another busy one in school, full of learning!

**October - The month of the Holy Rosary -** October is known as the Month of the Holy Rosary, a special time when Catholics all over the world are encouraged to pray the Rosary. The Rosary is a beautiful prayer that helps us think about important moments in the lives of Jesus and Mary. During this month, we are reminded that taking a little time each day to pray can bring us closer to God and fill our hearts with peace. At school and at home, children and families are invited to pray the Rosary together, even if it is just one decade, as a way of showing love and trust in Mary, our Mother in Heaven.






we see the world - it can free us from anxiety, give us confidence and inner strength, and help us keep growing in our love for one another.


A family full of faith is a family full of joy. Enjoy exploring this Sunday's Gospel and this Wednesday's word, which is FAITH.




### READ & REFLECT! Listen & Learn with Jesus, the Word!

you think of any other ways to help your family's faith to grow?



### **Nursery**

This week in Nursery, we have enjoyed singing the Nursery Rhyme 1,2,3,4,5 Once I caught a Fish alive! During our phonics sessions. We loved singing our new phonics song 'Bertha the Bus is going to the Zoo' this focuses on initial sounds in animal words as Bertha the Bus travels to the zoo.

For example: 's' for snake, 'j' for Jellyfish and 'z' for Zebra.

In our Maths focused work we have enjoyed our colour work looking at the colours 'green' and 'purple'. We have continued to sing maths songs to support our understanding of colours, shapes and numbers.

On Wednesday we enjoyed taking part in a 'Story Makers' session led by the Tameside Library service - we listened to a story and took part in a Dough Disco.

In our Celebration of the word sessions, we have continued to learn about the special items on our class altar- a candle, the Bible, a cross and a heart. Miss Taylor has helped us to begin to learn what these represent and how important they are to us.

We have loved singing our special songs- 'This little light of mine' and 'Magic Penny'.

In our RE session we have continued to listen to and learn the Story of Creation.

We have created actions to some of the key points of the story to help us remember what happened on each of the seven days.

Question-God said "Let there be...!"

### Reception

What a fantastic week we've had in Reception! The children are growing in confidence and knowledge every single day.

This week, we started our new topic all about looking back at when older members of our families were in Reception. Thank you to everyone who has already sent in interviews – we have loved watching them and finding out how things were different back then. In Literacy, we began our new class text *My Grandpa* – a beautiful story that shows the special bond between a grandparent and grandchild. We have summarised and sequenced the story, and even used emojis to think about how the characters were feeling. Next week, we will be retelling the story using a story map. In Maths, we have been thinking about appropriate size. For example: would a big bear eat the small sandwich at the teddy bear's picnic? We've also been introduced to lots of new mathematical vocabulary such as *big, small, large, tiny, medium, bigger,* and *smaller*. It has been wonderful hearing the children using their new learning confidently around the classroom. In RE, we continued to learn about the Story of Creation. We thought about how God gifted His creations to people and discussed how we can look after our own special gifts from God. In the outdoor area, Mrs Goldthorpe set up a Creation tuff tray where the children have been busy working through the story to make our world.

A big thank you again to everyone who came to the Phonics Workshop this week. It was lovely to have your support. The PowerPoint with key information from the session has now been emailed to all parents and carers.

We hope you have a lovely weekend – hopefully the weather doesn't stop you from having fun!

### **Year One**

This week was absolutely filled with exciting learning opportunities for our students! In maths, we introduced a new unit on addition and subtraction by exploring part-whole models. The children engaged enthusiastically, using these models to visualise and solve problems effectively. In English, we delved into our delightful 'I Like It When' book, where students thrived on completing various sentence activities, including filling in missing words, dictation, and unscrambling sentences. It was wonderful to see their creativity shine through! Our science lesson took us on a captivating listening walk, where we honed our sense of hearing and discovered the different sounds in our environment. In R.E., we focused on the importance of prayer, learning 'The Our Father' and discussing the significance of making the sign of the cross, which led to some thoughtful conversations. In history, we looked at the remarkable life of Queen Elizabeth II and created beautiful collages, combining art with history to celebrate her legacy. Lastly, the children truly made us proud as they recited their poem for Poetry Week with such passion and clarity.

### **Year Two**

We have had another busy week in Year 2! In Maths this week, we have been ordering and estimating 10s and 1s on a numberline up to 100. The children are working really hard with this. In English, our grammar focus has been on prepositions, and the children have been writing their own animal poems including these. On Wednesday, we enjoyed a fantastic History day, completing our Great Fire of London unit of work. The children particularly enjoyed learning about firegihting in 1666 vs today and redesigning their own map of London. In RE, we have been writing poetry keeping in mind the message from the Story of Noah, and discussing what it means to be Stewards of the Lord. We have also been embarking on our 'Rosary Challenge' and learning how to pray the Rosary. As the week came to a close, the children beautifully performed their poem 'Cats Sleep Anywhere'. The children continue to work hard in Phonics and Guided Reading - please continue to read your child's take home book with them at home.

Question - What prayer do we say when we pray the Rosary?

### **Year Three**

This week we have enjoyed practising the poem 'The Sound Collector' by Roger Gough as part of the activities for National Poetry Day. We have recited the poem together and thought of different actions we could do for each of the sounds taken away by the shadowy figure in the poem! The children performed the poem in assembly and did very well to remember the words and actions!

In Maths this week we have finished our work on place value by estimating numbers to 1,000 on a number line, and counting in 50s.

In English we have been looking at how to construct a simple sentence, and the children all made sure they punctuated their sentences correctly.

Question: Which sounds did the Sound Collector take away from the house?

### **Year Four**

This week we have enjoyed preparing for National Poetry Day by learning to recite the poem, 'Autumn Gilt' by Valerie Bloom. The children have done a great job of pronouncing each word clearly and reciting the poem rhythmically. They performed the poem in assembly today.

In Maths this week we have worked on rounding numbers to 10, 100 and 1000 and consolidating our understanding of ordering 4 digit numbers.

In English we have begun to write compound and complex sentences independently, basing them on our History topic of Egyptians.

In History, we answered questions about how and why the pyramids were built and looked at evidence which proves they were not built by slaves.

As we are now in October, we have begun to say a decade of the rosary every day.

Question: What would the pyramids have looked like originally?

### **Year Five**

We've had a wonderful week in Year 5, full of exciting learning and new experiences! In English, the children have been building on their knowledge of compound sentences, while in Maths they successfully completed the place value unit, practising rounding numbers up to a million. Our four-week art project also began this week, with the children enjoying a special session led by a local artist, exploring road safety images and experimenting with different ideas and compositions. 5LS took part in a thoughtful Religion retreat with Mrs Farmer, reflecting on how to care for God's creation through the teachings of *Laudato Si*. 5CP will take part in this later in the year. In History, the children delved into the fascinating world of Mayan numbers, and they also had a lovely time at Forest School with Mrs Artingstall, where they created their own clay pots. It has certainly been a busy and rewarding week!

### **Year Six**

What a fantastic week in Year 6! The children thoroughly enjoyed Poetry Week, particularly exploring *My Grandma's Bonsai Tree by Ben Mayoh*, where they analysed language choices, answered inference questions, and developed their performance skills before confidently showcasing their verses in a KS2 poetry assembly. In English, we focused on strengthening our GAPS knowledge by identifying subjects, verbs, and objects in single-clause sentences. We then moved on to exploring prepositions and how to use them effectively in our writing. The children showed great focus and creativity—we'll be revisiting prepositions next week before moving on to multi-clause sentences. In Maths, we worked on multiplying 4-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers using the formal written method, and the children showed fantastic determination and resilience—well done! A special highlight this week was 6DF's class assembly on Thursday, where they proudly shared their learning - a huge thank you to all who came to support!
