






When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, "All these things you are staring at now - the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: they will all have been knocked down." And they put to

him this question: "Master," they said, "when will this happen then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?" "Take care not to be deceived," he said, "because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he' and 'The time is near at hand'. Refuse to join them." Then he said to them, "When you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened. There will be wars, earthquakes, plagues and famines here and there; there will be great signs in the heavens. 


READ & REFLECT! Listen & Learn with Jesus, the Word!

Nursery

On Monday, Nursery took part in Geography Spatial awareness day. We explored maps, discussing what they are used for and where you would find one. We loved looking at a map of the world and finding different countries on our class globe.

On Tuesday, we took part in a special celebration of the word for Remembrance Day, we have been learning new words and their meanings- Poppy- Wreath- 2 minute silence-soldiers. We were very respectful when taking part in a 2 minute silence and we can confidently talk about the importance of Remembrance day.

On Wednesday, we welcomed Greg from Mark 10 Mission to our school, we were honoured to join with our friends in Reception and take part in a special Celebration led by Greg learning about Psalm 23- 'The Lord is my Shepherd'. We especially loved singing with Greg 'He is the Vine (Banner over me is love)'.

On Thursday we took part in Michael Rosen Day- we loved listening to his story 'We're going on a Bear Hunt!' and we joined in with the actions and sounds within the story.

We have had a fabulous week, full of learning. Have a great weekend!

Reception

Another jam-packed week in Reception! It has absolutely flown by.

In Literacy, we created a story map for our story "The Leaf Thief" and used actions to help us retell it. The children then had a go at making their own story maps, and they did such a fabulous job! In Maths, we've been exploring the numbers 4 and 5 — thinking about the different ways we can represent them and how they are made up of smaller numbers. The children have enjoyed using practical resources to show their understanding.

In RE, we reflected on how each and every one of us is a gift from God. We thought about what makes us special and what gifts God has given us. The children loved passing around a special gift box and sharing why they are a gift. We also enjoyed a Celebration of the Word with Greg from The Mark 10 Mission, who helped us think about The Good Shepherd. Thank you, Greg! On Tuesday we took some time to remember the fallen soldiers. We made a cross out of poppies and were very respectful during the two minute silence. Thank you, Reception!

Year One

What an exciting week it has been with lots of special theme days! We kicked off the week with Spatial Sense Day in Geography where we explored different maps, learnt the four compass points and created a map of our own classroom.

The highlight of our week was our visit from Mark 10 Mission's Greg. We participated in a beautiful Celebration of the Word; all the children were extremely respectful.

On Thursday, to celebrate Michael Rosen day, we joined an online webinar where he was able to share some of his work.

In R.E, we learnt about Mary's visit to Elizabeth and how we say the words from this special event in the Hail Mary prayer.

In English, we have been identifying and writing the subject of sentences.

In Maths, we have been adding and subtracting one or two and finding a part.

We ended the week with a beautiful Mass; all the children were extremely well-behaved.

Year Two

This week has been a week of special events and themed days! The week began with our Spatial Sense Day in Geography where we explored aerial and ground views and their relationship to maps. We labelled aerial views of our school and surrounding area and identified routes from school to local landmarks.

Tuesday saw us mark Remembrance Day by producing our own poppies and observing two minutes silence at 11am. We also held a Celebration of the Word to reflect on this important day and the sacrifices made by all those involved in conflicts around the world.

On Wednesday, we welcomed Greg from the Mark 10 Mission, who led an inspiring whole school assembly before working with year 2 to consider the messages within the Gospel reading John 10: 11-13.

Finally, on Friday, we celebrated Mass in church themed around spreading peace. All of the children were respectful and sang beautifully. We are incredibly proud of their achievements.

Year Three

We have had an exciting and busy week in Year 3 this week.

On Monday it was Spatial Sense Day, and we enjoyed learning about 4 figure grid references and studying the physical and human geographical features of Droylsden.

On Tuesday, we participated in activities for Remembrance Day and made a beautiful poppy. We also wrote a diary entry from the point of view of a World War One soldier during 'The Truce', a true event which saw German and British soldiers holding a truce on Christmas Day in 1914 and playing football together.

On Wednesday, we were lucky enough to meet Greg from the Mark 10 Mission, who led us in a beautiful Celebration of the Word in the hall. The children enjoyed their time with him, and Greg commented on how thoughtful the children's questions were. In art, we have started to explore the medium of charcoal and enjoyed making light and dark lines, smudging the charcoal to make varying shades.

Year Four

This has been an extra busy week in Year 4.

Today we enjoyed a full day at the Aviva Studios in Manchester where we took part in two poetry workshops led by two well-known children's poets - Matt Goodfellow and Ruth Awolola.

On Wednesday the children were excited to meet Greg from Mark 10 Mission. He led a Celebration of the Word for Year 4 which was very inspiring.

On Remembrance Day, each child made a poppy and wrote prayers and messages of gratitude on the petals. 4HG had their class assembly on Thursday. The children enjoyed showing their beautiful work to family and friends.

In Maths we continued with our unit on the area of rectangles. The children had to draw their own shapes with given areas. They have also been working hard on their 8 times table. Monday was Spatial Awareness Day which saw the children looking at symbols and keys on Ordnance Survey maps as well as learning about coordinates on map grids.

Year Five

What a busy week we have had in Year 5!

The week started with our Spatial Sense Day, where the children learnt all about Relief maps and Contour lines (not the make up ones, which was the first answer to the question! :)). They investigated the terrain of Greater Manchester and created their own 3D layer map.

We created poppies to be taken to the local Cenotaph, the children wrote their own poems on the back and planted them in ground, they looked fantastic!

We also had a workshop from Greg at Mark10 mission, which the children really enjoyed, they got to listen to his story and ask questions.

Amongst all that action we have also been looking at present and past participles and expanded noun phrases in English, Prime numbers and factors in Maths, Investigated air resistance in Science and continued looking at the 10 Commandments in RE.

Year Six

Year 6 have had a busy and exciting week! We started with a visit from *Magistrates in the Community*, where the children learned about the justice system, the role of a magistrate and how our choices can lead to different consequences. They listened brilliantly and asked some very thoughtful questions.

In English, the children worked hard on writing multi-clause compound and complex sentences before using their knowledge of Jewish children in WWII to create a model plan and contribute to the first two paragraphs of a non-chronological report. Next week, they're looking forward to writing paragraphs of their own, utilising what we have learnt.

In Maths, the children showed great determination as they continued learning about fractions, practising adding and subtracting them and tackling mixed numbers with growing confidence.

We also enjoyed a thoughtful Celebration of the Word with Greg from the Mark 10 Mission, where the children shared respectful and insightful reflections. We're very proud of their efforts. Well done Year 6!
