



Sacramental Programme



Nursery

This week in Nursery we have completed our learning about Autumn.

We have consolidated our learning and have worked really hard learning lots of new vocabulary such as hibernate and nocturnal.

In Maths, we completed our learning of the number 2. We can recognise this number, sing songs and subitise. We loved going on a number hunt around our nursery outdoor area earlier on in the week looking for different coloured numbers 2s. It was lots of fun! Our number recognition was great too!

In Phonics we have been busy learning the nursery rhyme 'Hickory, Dickory, Dock' and creating actions for the rhyme also. Our sound focus this week has been the 'P' sound- we know that pizza, pen, pencil, pin and penguin all begin with this sound.

We have enjoyed learning about Christ the King in our focused carpet time sessions, we know that it is a special time to celebrate Jesus, that Jesus teaches us to love, Jesus is Kind and Jesus is always with us. We shared with each other who we all love and the special reasons why we love them.

In RE, we have been learning about the Annunciation, we know that God sent Jesus to love us and that Mary was chosen by God to give birth to his Son.

Our Christmas Nativity rehearsals are well underway!

We can't wait to perform for you on **Tuesday 9th December at 9.30am** in the School Hall.

This years nativity is called 'A wriggly nativity!'

Reception

The weeks are flying by! This week, we have started our new topic all about Christmas and celebrations.

Our new class text is "Jesus' Christmas Party" and we have really immersed ourselves in the story. The children have written story summaries, sequenced the events, and explored how the innkeeper felt at different moments.

In our snack and recall sessions, we have begun learning our key statements:

- 1. Christmas is Jesus' birthday.
 - 2. Mary is Jesus' mother.
- 3. Not all people celebrate Christmas.

In maths, we have been learning about shapes with four sides and shapes that do not have four sides. The children have been using key vocabulary such as sides and corners to explain their thinking.

In RE, we moved on to the next part of the first Christmas story, when the shepherds came to visit baby Jesus. We sequenced this part of the story and learnt what the host of angels sang to them:

"Glory to God." We also enjoyed a lovely class mass in church all about winter.

We are now well under way with our nativity rehearsals. If your child has a speaking part, please do continue to practise at home.

Year One

This week has been assessment week and we are so proud of the resilience our Year 1 children have shown during this.

In R.E, we examined artwork of the birth of Jesus and reflected on what they tell us about Jesus. We also listened to the words of Luke's Gospel describing the angels' message to the shepherds.

In Celebration of the Word, we reflected on this week's Gospel through meditation as we enter the first week of Advent.

In Geography, we have built on our knowledge of the four countries of the United Kingdom by naming the capital cities of these countries.

We ended the week with a PSHE lesson where we thought about how God loves us. Alongside this, we have been practising our carol service; we are so impressed with how the children are learning their lines and the songs!

Question: What did the angels tell the shepherds?

Year Two

This week has been assessment week across school. The children have been working hard to complete assessments in Reading, Maths and Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar. We are very proud of their achievements. Well done Year 2!

In English, we have started our new unit of work based on 'Little Robin Red Vest' by Jan Fearnley. Using colourful semantics, the children explored creating list sentences incorporating both conjunctions and commas. They identified examples and non-examples and fixed errors in punctuation and structure.

In Geography, we used compass points to identify the location of continents and oceans in relation to each other. We also explored climates across all seven continents before drawing weather symbols on a map of the world. The children could understand and explain that the climate is hotter in continents closer to the equator. They also recognised that large continents, such as Asia, can experience very different climates in the north and south.

RE this week has centred around what we know about Mary and her various titles. The children made links to the Hail Mary and Elizabeth's realisation that Mary is the Blessed One during the Visitation.

Which continent has the coldest climate? Why?

Year Three

It has been another busy week in Year 3.

This week has been assessment week and all children have worked hard and tried their best as they completed assessments in Reading, Maths and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling. Well done to Year 3 for their mature attitude towards their work!

Yesterday was our first class assembly of the year and we were so proud of how well the children showcased their work in R.E., History and Art. Everyone read and sang so beautifully. Thank you to all parents, grandparents, carers and friend who attended our assembly.

In R.E. this week we have been looking at what happens during mass and we enjoyed writing about what happens during each part.

In English, we have been looking at different adverbials to add more detail to our sentences.

Question: What happens in mass during the Liturgy of the Word?

Year Four

The children have all worked hard this week to complete assessments in English and Maths.

We also began our first Geography unit which is about Spain. In the first lesson we looked at Spain's location and noted the countries and seas surrounding it.

In Spanish, we completed our unit on 'The Seasons' by writing a sentence for each one and saying which our favourite season is.

In RE, we looked at what happens during the mass, noting in detail what both the congregation and the priest do during different parts of service.

In Science we began a new unit on States of Matter. In the first lesson we learnt the characteristics of solids, liquids and gases, giving examples of each one.

In English we planned and began to write our own pieces of writing. The children had to rewrite the beginning of the story 'The Lost Happy Endings.'

Question: What is a 'monstrance?'

Year Five

This week the children have been completing the Maths, Reading and GAPS assessments, working incredibly hard showing how much they have already learnt this term.

The children have started a new topic in RE called Prophecy and Promise and already learnt about some of God's chosen leaders. We have looked at Samuel, Joseph and Saul, leading to David being anointed the new King.

In Maths the children have started looking at fractions, they are revisiting equivalent fractions at present.

In English the children are about to start their own independent write and have been learning how to include expanded noun phrases, prepositional phrases and relative clauses to make their sentences more interesting.

And finally the children have started a new topic in Geography - Brazil. They have learnt where Brazil is and how to locate it on a map.

Which Continent is Brazil located in?

Year Six

What an excellent week we have had in Year 6!

Firstly, we had a visit from Safety Squad, who talked with the children about Digital Safety, Fire Safety and Peer Pressure. All of the children joined in with the discussions and behaved impeccably throughout. The sessions were extremely informative and should be extremely useful for the future.

In Maths, we have concentrated on decimals this week. Initially, this focused on the place value of decimals and then moved on to adding, subtracting and multiplying decimals.

Our English work has been centred around our class reading book, which is A Christmas Carol. We have looked at modal verbs, semicolons and fronted adverbials. The children did a fantastic job of applying their learning into writing about Scrooge and the ghosts who visited him. Finally, our R.E. work on leaders has continued this week. We have particularly looked at Joshua, Samuel and Saul who were all leaders in the Bible but to different levels of success. We created fact files and interpreted scripture in the lead-up to David being anointed as King.

Question: Why did Samuel grieve Saul even though he was still alive?
