Second Sunday of Advent - This Sunday's Gospel invites us to do more than just prepare our homes - it calls us to prepare our hearts. In the Gospel reading, John the Baptist encourages everyone to "repent" — to turn back toward God, to reflect, and to make space for Christ in our lives. This kind of "repentance" isn't about guilt — it's a positive, hopeful act: an opportunity to change, to re-orient ourselves, and to grow in love and kindness. As we step closer to Christmas, let's use this season to welcome God's love more fully into our lives. Let's be ready to receive - and to share - that love with everyone we meet.





be able to prepare for our own journey






Listen & Learn with Jesus, the Word!




Growing in Goodness & Love: This Wednesday's Word...

Nursery

Nursery have had such a busy week preparing for 'A Wriggly Nativity.'

The children have worked so hard learning songs and dances and they look amazing in their costumes! We are so proud of all their hard work and can't wait to perform it to you on

Tuesday 9th December at 9.30am in the School Hall. In class this week we have been learning all about Advent.

We know that an Advent wreath has three purple candles, one pink and one white candle.

A new candle is lit each Sunday during Advent until all four are burning.

Each candle has has a different meaning.

We know it is a time when we start to prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus and reflect on his life. We have also been learning about the Nativity, we can talk about the main people in the story and discuss why they are important and their role in the story.

In our focused RE sessions, we have been learning that Jesus was born in Bethlehem and that the Shepherds visited the Manger.

We have enjoyed decorating our Nursery environment for Christmas this week and in our continuous provision we have enjoyed lots of Christmas themed activities.

Reception

We are so proud of the children this week – you are in for such a treat with our class nativity. They are working so hard and we cannot wait for you to watch their performance.

As always, we have been super busy in Reception. In Literacy, we have retold our class text "Jesus' Christmas Party" using a story map. In Maths, we have been thinking about zero, what it means and how we can represent it. In RE, we learnt about St Francis and the tradition of the Christmas crib. We also really enjoyed our time in church following the Laudato Si Prayer Trail.

We finished off the week by performing at our Christmas coffee morning, giving everyone a little sneak peek of what to expect next week.

Year One

We have had a busy and exciting week in Year One!

This week in English, we began our new story, *The Grinch Who Stole Christmas*. The children enjoyed exploring the characters and events, and we focused especially on recognising and using irregular past-tense action verbs. In Maths, we have continued to consolidate our mental arithmetic skills within 10. In Geography, the children successfully located Manchester and Droylsden on the map and talked about what they know about these places. This week in Science we focused on materials. The children explored the classroom and identified objects made from wood, metal, plastic, and fabric. In R.E., we ordered stories from Luke and learned how Christians sing the *Gloria* like the angels did, celebrating God's presence. Year One have also been completing their phonics assessments. At this point in the year, we expect children to be reading Phase 4 Set 2 / Phase 5 Set 1 to be on track to meet the expected level in reading. Thank you for supporting reading at home—it makes a big difference.

The children were fantastic singing some of the songs from our carol service at the coffee morning. They made everyone very proud! We finished the week beautifully with a lovely Mass.

Year Two

What a busy week we have had in

Year 2!

In Maths this week, the children have impressed us with their resilience with addition and subtraction of 2 digits from another 2 digit number. In English, we have been solidifying our knowledge of commas in lists, and identifying where they should be in sentences about Little Robin Red Vest. In Geography, we have identified and located oceans from across the gl0be on a map. As we approach Christmas, we have been hearing the stories of the birth of John and the birth of Jesus, and using artwork to retell them from the account of Luke's Gospel. We also explored the Advent Wreath and lit our candle in Celebration of the Word. We ended the week by performing some songs from our upcoming Nativity at our coffee morning, and enjoyed attending a beautiful Mass along with Year 1 and Year 3.

Year Three

This week, we attended Mass with Father C and participated in an Advent prayer trail around our church which the children really enjoyed. In RE, the children explored the Penitential Rite, learning about its significance and how it is part of our mass. They reflected on the importance of forgiveness, deepening their understanding of this essential part of the liturgy.

This week, Year 3 has been working on their times tables during our multiplication and division unit of learning. They've been exploring different strategies to help them understand and memorise the 3, 4 and 6 times tables.

In English, the children have been finishing their modelled writing on *The Tin Forest*. They've been using superlative adjectives, exclamation sentences, and adverbial phrases of time and manner to make their writing descriptive.

Year Four

This week Year 4 enjoyed a retreat day in class with Mrs Farmer. It was a lovely time for the children to think about the season of Advent and how they can prepare for the coming of Jesus. This was done through prayer, song and quiet reflection. The children made Advent promises too. In RE we looked at 'The Gloria' prayer and discussed its meaning.

In English the children completed a piece of writing modelled by the teacher. This was all about the main character in our story, Jub. The writing had to include some of the subordinating conjunctions we have been working on.

In Maths we have worked hard on the 7 times table and the children are practising their recall of all the tables every week.

Continuing with our Geography work on Spain, we used atlases to locate some of the country's physical features.

On Wednesday the children enjoyed following the Advent Prayer Trail in church, It was a lovely opportunity to immerse themselves in Advent scripture.

Year Five

This week Year 5 have been to church for the Advent Prayer Trail, which the children enjoyed. It got them to really think about the meaning of Advent. In RE we have been looking at leaders, and what characteristics they display and what makes a good leader. They have been understanding how and why David was to become the new anointed King and how Samuel felt during this transition.

In Maths the children have continued with their learning of fractions, understanding mixed number and improper fractions. They are also now starting to learn how to compare fractions less than 1.

We have been learning about the physical geography of three areas of Brazil: The Amazon Basin, The Pantanal and the Brazilian Highlands.

In English the children have been putting their knowledge of relative clauses, expanded noun phrases and prepositional phrases into their writing.

Year Six

Year 6 have had a very productive and engaging week. In Maths, the children have strengthened their understanding of decimals, confidently multiplying and dividing them before applying these skills to a range of problem-solving questions. Their hard work has been excellent.

In English, we revisited similes and metaphors in preparation for writing monologues from Scrooge's perspective. The children took part in a modelled write and contributed thoughtful ideas, helping to create a strong example to support their independent writing next week.

In RE, we explored the story of David and Goliath, linking it to our discussions about the qualities of a good leader. On Wednesday, we visited church for a prayer trail led by Mrs Artingstall and the Laudato Si' champions; the children were respectful and reflective throughout.

On Thursday, some pupils visited the Little Sisters of the Poor care home to share their poems about celebration with the residents. They represented our school wonderfully. A massive well done to all involved!
