






Enjoy reading this Sunday's Gospel


While John the Baptist was in prison, he heard what Christ was doing and he sent some of his followers to ask Christ, "Are you the one sent by God, or do we have to wait for someone else?" Jesus answered, "Go back and tell John what you hear and see:

the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cured, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life. The Good News is being announced to the poor; and happy are those who do not lose faith in me." As the messengers were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the people about John: "He is the one of whom scripture says: 'Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way before you'. I tell you solemnly, of all the children born of women, one greater than John the Baptist has never been seen; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is.

What did John send some of his followers to ask Jesus? In this Sunday's Gospel, John the Baptist had heard about Jesus Christ's miracles and all the other wonderful things that he was doing. Christ was offering people forgiveness and healing, both physical and spiritual. Forgiving and healing was his task all those years ago and, if we put our trust in him, this is what he can do for us even today. Ask your child what they think the word 'Christ' means (parent help: the word 'Christ' means 'the anointed one', the one who is sent to save the world). It may help your child if you share something that you know and like about Christ.

"For those who love, nothing is too difficult, especially when it is done for the love of Jesus Christ." St Ignatius of Loyola

Jesus Christ came to draw everyone into his love - to joyfully share in God's own life. How can we live and love more like Christ as we journey through Advent? Perhaps we can: always try to be fair, honest, generous and ready to go out of our way to help anyone who is in need; as a family, resolve to support a local or national good cause in the coming new year; make a special effort to let other family members know how much we love them. We have continued our learning in class about the First Christmas.

We are confident in talking about the main events and can answer questions about Baby Jesus and his birth.

We have loved sharing your special prayerful moments from home in class with the 'Travelling Nativity.'

In RE, we have continued our learning about Advent.

We have been learning about the traditions behind the Advent wreath and what the candles on the wreath symbolise in the lead up to Christmas.

We have enjoyed lots of creative activities this week in preparation for Christmas.

We can't wait to have lots more creative fun next week as we prepare for the Christmas break.

Please note that next Wednesday **17th December** is Christmas Dinner Day and Thursday **18th December** is Christmas Party Day.

Reception

WOW! What a week! We are so incredibly proud of our little superstars. They have come such a long way since their very first day in September, and now they are singing, dancing and acting on a stage in front of their friends, teachers and families. Thank you to everyone who came to watch our performances — we truly hope you enjoyed the play as much as we enjoyed performing it for you all. We really are the proudest team. Well done, Reception! In Literacy, we wrapped up our work on our class text Jesus' Christmas Party and focused on understanding the sequence of events in the story.

In Maths, we have been consolidating our learning on recognising and representing numbers 0-5

In RE, we explored the meaning of Advent. We learned that Advent means preparing for the coming of Jesus. We went on a walk around school to look for signs of our preparations. The children spotted Christmas trees, purple prayer focus cloths, Advent wreaths, Advent calendars and nativity scenes without Baby Jesus.

A big thank you to everyone who has sent in their celebration photos. We have loved sharing them as a class. It has been really special learning about different celebrations such as Eid, and we feel very lucky to have friends who can teach us about these important times.

Year One

A huge well done to all the children this week for their roles in our Carol Concert. All the children have practised extremely hard with their singing and lines and it was beautiful to see them perform so confidently for you yesterday. We hope you enjoyed it!

Alongside this, we have been completing some of our units for this term. We have been writing sentences in the past tense about how The Grinch stole Christmas.

In Maths, we have been consolidating our understanding of addition and subtraction and applying these skills to solve balanced equations.

In R.E, we described ways that we celebrate Christmas in school and in the community.

We have started our D&T unit by designing our own capes and we have been starting to make these towards the end of the week.

Year Two

It has been an extremely busy week in Year 2 preparing for our production of Lights, Camel, Action. The children have all been amazing, working hard to learn lines, songs and dances. We are very proud of their achievements, as we are sure you are.

In RE this week, we have been exploring the symbolism of the Advent Wreath and waiting in hope for the birth of Jesus. We also investigated the traditions of Las Posados, which is a festival celebrated during Advent in Mexico. During the celebrations, people dress as Joseph and Mary and create paper bag lanterns (luminaries) to light the path for Jesus.

In Maths this week, we have been subtracting a two 2 digit numbers across a 10. Using base 10 and place value charts, the children exchanged tens to ones to complete the calculations.

This week also saw the completion of our English unit of work. Applying their work on list sentences, compound subjects, compound sentences and common and proper nouns, the children retold the story of Little Robin Red Vest using picture prompts. They are all working so hard in all areas of the curriculum.

Ouestion: How can we look after our oceans?

Year Three

We have had another busy yet enjoyable week in Year 3. Today was 3LH's last swimming session at Medlock. Mrs Herbert has been so proud of how hard the children have worked to improve their skills and confidence in the water. It is 3MD's turn next and their swimming lessons will start in January!

In English, we have been working very hard writing a setting description of the Dream Forest, inspired by the Tin Forest book. We have included different types of sentences, such as exclamation sentences and statements, along with different types of adjectives (such as comparative and superlative adjectives). We have been so impressed with the children's vocabulary choices and their independence when writing. In RE, we have been looking at the symbols associated with Advent, and the children had some fantastic ideas explaining which symbols they thought were most important and why. In Maths, we have been consolidating our understanding of the 3 and 4 times tables, applying our knowledge to solve word problems.

What type of punctuation comes at the end of an exclamation sentence?

Year Four

It's been a very busy week in Year 4. We have been exploring the symbols and signs of Advent and talking about their significance. The children had to write about which objects connected with Advent were most important for them.

In English, the children wrote a text about the character of the witch from our story 'The Lost Happy Endings,' doing their best to include a range of conjunctions and to use punctuation accurately.

In Maths we completed our unit on multiplication and division which involved the children solving a range of problems and puzzles which challenged their thinking.

In Geography we identified some of Spain's major cities and compared their populations. The children located them on a map of Spain and linked some of the most famous football stadiums to these cities.

The children are continuing to work hard on their times tables every day.

Question: Which city is the capital of Spain?

Year Five

We've had a great week in Year 5!

The children have been working hard to complete their independent write on the impact of pollination on the city, inspired by *Bee and Me* by Alison Jay.

In Maths, they have been practising how to compare and order fractions with different denominators, showing fantastic focus and perseverance. Please continue to support them at home by practising their times tables regularly.

In Religion, we explored the story of David and Goliath, reflecting on the leadership qualities

David showed and looking closely at the covenant he made.

We have also been practising our Christmas carols for our carol service, which will take place on Tuesday next week.

5LS have also been working hard during their cornet lessons to learn a Christmas song for you to hear. We hope to share it on class dojo next week.

A highlight of the week was watching Year 2's wonderful Nativity performance. We are very much looking forward to our final week before Christmas!

Year Six

Year 6 have had another wonderful week!

In Maths, we have been working our way through units of measurement. Initially, this focused on metric measures of length, mass and capacity, however we then moved on to converting measure into other units. We finished the week by looking at imperial units of measure and realised why it is much easier to work with metric measures!

In English, the children have produced some excellent monologues from the perspective of Scrooge during the visit of the Ghost of Christmas Future. Writing monologues can feel unusual and unnatural at times but we have been so impressed with the work that the children have produced.

Our R.E. work has centred on King David, looking specifically at his Psalms and how he acted as a king. We were particularly good at analysing the scripture to see why David was thankful to God. Finally, the highlight of the week was watching our Special Friends in their nativity dress rehearsal - we were so impressed!

Question: What is a psalm?
