This investment has had a profoundly positive impact on our pupils and has enabled us to set ambitious goals and reach greater heights.

We are proud to have been awarded the *School Games Platinum Award* consistently since 2019—recognition of the commitment and hard work of both pupils and staff across the full breadth of the PE curriculum, including participation in school-based and competitive sporting events. Furthermore, Ravenbank has achieved notable success in out-of-school sports competitions at local, district, and county level.
