A Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers

Our penultimate week before Christmas has seen our first nativity concert and the school Christmas Fair. Alongside the preparation and excitement, we have also still been learning lots and Mrs Reyes and Mrs Thornton have been enjoying watching every class in school do Maths. Let's see what else everyone has been doing.

This week, Nursery children have been perfecting their Nativity. They have been looking at numbers which appear in a book called 'Father Christmas needs a wee'.

In Reception, pupils have been learning about 'Stickman' – another Julia Donaldson book. They have made play-do stickmen and have written letters to stickman. They have played a skittles counting game. The children have also enjoyed performing in their own nativity.

In Year 1, children looked at 3D shapes in Maths, recognised, named and sorted them according to their properties. They have made their seasonal themed calendars and have finished practising for their Christmas sing-a-long.

In Year 2, children are very excited to perform their nativity next week to their parents..

Year 3 children have been looking at their 3 times and 4 times tables. They have also thought about multiples of 3's and 4's to help them with quick counting of this. In English, they have been writing facts about foxes.

Year 4 pupils have been learning how Greece is different to Stockport. In English lessons, they have been writing letters to the Wicked Witch.

Year 5 children have done lots of work on fractions. In English, they have written adventure stories based on King Kong and in History they have been learning about modern day slavery.

Year 6 pupils have been dividing fractions in Maths and have started their new topic on measurements. They have also started to write their flashback narratives too.

No assemblies this week as our final rehearsals have been taking place. Ask your child about the assemblies they have enjoyed hearing this year. I have already had requests from children for stories in the new year so watch this space!


Boo the Badger
