This week, Nursery children have been settling into school again after Christmas and have welcomed some new friends to their class. They have enjoyed indoor P.E and going for a winter walk.

In Reception, pupils have been settling back into their routines. They have enjoyed looking at the snow and ice. They have designed winter jumpers to help keep them warm and created snowmen too. What a wonderfully wintry week!

In Year 1, children have started to look at numbers up to 20. They have started their new story called 'Hermelin'. They have looked at colour mixing and what the primary and secondary colours are and how mixing colours changes colours.

In Year 2, children have been learning about money and adding money together to get totals. They have started their new book called 'The Night Gardener'.

Year 3 children have started their topic on Ancient Egyptians and made a timeline. They have also looked at Ancient Egyptian art.

Year 4 pupils have started their topic on the Romans and have made a Roman museum in class. They have also started their turn at swimming which replaces their indoor P.E sessions until Easter. The children really enjoyed their first experience of school swimming.

Year 5 pupils have been looking at Anglo-Saxons. They have also been practicing for Young Voices and taking notes about non-fiction.

Year 6 children have started their topic on the Victorians and have been making observations using primary resources. In Maths, they have started their topic on ratio and in English they are writing a newspaper report. Luckily, they have had lots of practice when writing this newsletter!

Throughout school, I have been really proud this week to see the beautiful manners that our children have been using throughout the day – thanking each other for opening or holding doors, showing gratitude and thanks to one another and showing the Woodies way in all that they do. Boo the Badger




