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A Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers

It has been a busy old week at Warren Wood with our curriculum in full swing with lots of new learning taking place. Let's see what everyone has been learning about.

This week, Nursery children have been learning about penguins and have been painting self-portraits.

In Reception, pupils have been creating their own cardboard tube superheroes and their own superhero masks. They have also been matching quantities to numbers.

In Year 1, children have been experimenting with different shades of green to create nature pictures. They have written a character description using exciting adjectives. Their new indoor P.E unit is dance.

In Year 2, children have been learning about the Great Fire of London. They have also been learning about Islam and healthy eating.

Year 3 children have been looking at Light and Dark in Science. In P.E, they have been developing point and patch balances and in French, they are looking at French verbs.

Year 4 pupils have made carved models out of soap. They have started a new topic in Maths and are trying new groups. They are now also a couple of chapters into their new book 'Land of Roar' – this is always a firm favourite for Y4 pupils.

Year 5 children have started to talk about why some materials are completely wrong such as a teapot made from chocolate. In History, they have been fascinated by Viking artefacts and are looking forward to a visit from their Viking visitor on Monday.

Year 6 pupils have been writing a newspaper report about a refugee being found alive after being stranded at sea for several days. They have also enjoyed practising singing the songs for Young Voices.

We've had a busy week once more with slightly better weather, albeit still cold. Our assembly this week focused on an artist called Jean-Michel Basquiat. Ask your child these two questions – 'What type of art is he famous for?' and 'Who was his idol who he became friends with?'

Boo the Badger



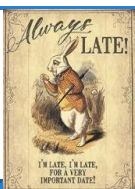
