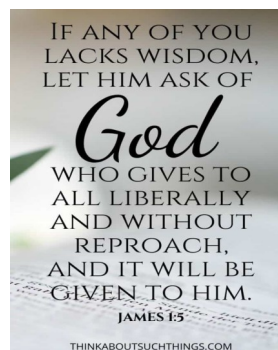

Reminders

We would just like to remind you of the school uniform rules in school-

- Extreme hair styles are not permitted- This includes, Mohicans, coloured hair, tramlines and hair shaved lower than a number 2.
 - Long hair should be tied back - plain hairbands in school colours only
- Jewellery is not permitted for safety reasons in school. Only stud earrings should be worn. These should be removed on PE days prior to the children coming to school. Staff are not permitted to remove earrings from a child. If earrings can't be removed, they will need be covered with a plaster before the children come to school. Watches are permitted but will be removed for PE. No smart watches or fit bits allowed in school.
 - Children are not permitted to wear gel or coloured nail varnish.

Children MUST NOT wear acrylic nails for school. Children will not be permitted to take part in PE if wearing acrylic nails.

We have noticed a number of pupils wearing nail varnish and acrylic nails for school, we understand that over the Christmas period children may have had nails done for special occasions however please can you ensure that these are removed now we are back in school so adhere with our school uniform policy.
