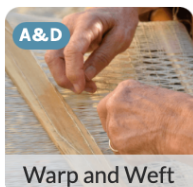

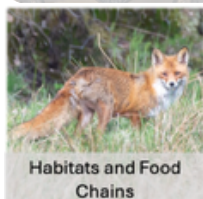
Food and the Digestive System - Producers and consumers; ecosystems; food chains and food webs; changes in ecosystems; digestive system; teeth types – incisors, canines, premolars, molars; teeth health and dental hygiene. Working scientifically – identifying and classifying, observing changes over time, comparative test, pattern seeking, research.



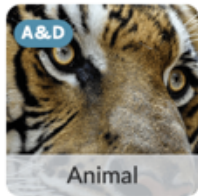
Warp and Weft - Weaving; exploring yarns.
This project teaches children about life in Britain after the Roman withdrawal. Children will learn about Anglo-Saxon and Viking invasions up to the Norman conquest.



Roman withdrawal from Britain; chronology of Anglo-Saxon invasion; Anglo-Saxon kingdoms, beliefs and customs; religion and everyday life in Anglo-Saxon Britain; Viking invasion; everyday life in Viking Britain; significant people – King Athelstan; Norman invasion; legacy.



Embark on an enlightening journey exploring habitats and food chains, where we will discover the intricate relationships between living things and their environments. Through engaging activities, we will identify producers, predators, and prey, fostering a deeper understanding of ecological balance and the importance of biodiversity in our natural world.



This project teaches children about the historical and cultural portrayal of animals in art. They study the visual qualities of animals through sketching and printmaking.
