
Writing


Projects



In 'Frozen Kingdom', we will learn about: North America as a continent focussing in on the Arctic regions; lines of latitude and longitude; polar climates (including the antarctic); polar day and night; polar oceans; polar landscapes; climate change; natural resources; indigenous people and tourism.



In 'Inuit', we will learn about print making and carving. In 'Environmental Artists', we will be creating environmental art using recycled, reused and repurposed materials.




This project teaches children about the genre of environmental art. They study how artists create artwork that addresses social and political issues related to the natural and urban environment. Children work collaboratively to create artwork with an environmental message.



This project teaches children how living things on Earth have changed over time and how fossils provide evidence for this. They learn how characteristics are passed from parents to their offspring and how variation in offspring can affect their survival, with changes (adaptations) possibly leading to the evolution of a species.

We will be: classifying living things; using classification keys and looking at how animals adapt to their environments.





This project teaches children about sketchbooks, observational drawing, mixed media collage and Pop Art. They consolidate their learning to make a final piece of artwork inspired by bees, beetles or butterflies.
