On Tuesday, Wayne and Matt from 'I can save a life' visited West Street for the 3rd year to teach first aid skills to every class from Reception to Year 6. First Aid is included within the PSHE curriculum.

Wayne and Matt were impressed with the children's behaviour, how much they remembered from a year ago as well as their focus during activities. Younger children practised how to deal with low level accidents while Year 5 and Year 6 learnt CPR and the information you need when you make a 999 phone call. Knowing and being able to use First Aid is a really important life skill.




This half-term's WRITING COMPETITION WINNERS

Getting ready for September

Children in all classes from the new Reception group to the current Year 5 will be taking part in three transition afternoons to meet their new teacher.

The next transition afternoons will be on Wednesday 25th June and Wednesday 9th July. These afternoons are a great opportunity for children and staff to get to know each other.

Mrs Kozlow will have 1:1 meetings with parents of new Reception children on Monday 7th and Tuesday 8th July.

Year 5 are also involved in a high school taster day at Park High on Wednesday 2nd July. Staff from high schools will be coming in to meet Year 6 at West Street over the next few weeks. In addition, Year 6 will be spending time at their new high schools.

What is the school uniform?

Our school uniform consists of:

- Navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan – parents can either buy plain navy sweatshirts or cardigans from supermarkets OR navy sweatshirts or cardigans with the school logo from the school office.
- White or pale blue polo shirt
- Navy blue, grey or black trousers
- Navy blue, grey or black skirt or pinafore dress
- Sensible dark shoes – no fashion shoes/boots/trainers please
- It is important that all items of clothing, especially outdoor wear - coats, gloves, hats and scarves - are clearly labelled with your child's name

P.E. Kit

Children wear a white T-shirt and dark plain shorts with pumps for indoor P.E. and trainers for outdoor P.E. to change into. Dark plain tracksuit bottoms or leggings can be worn for outdoor P.E. in colder weather. Each class has one indoor and one outdoor P.E. lesson every week at the same time/day. All P.E. kit should be kept in a drawstring bag. Drawstring bags with the school logo can be bought from the school office. All P.E. kit, including the drawstring bag, must be clearly labelled with your child's name.

Jewellery

We follow Lancashire County Council guidelines about jewellery and ask that children wear no more than one pair of stud earrings. Earrings must be removed for P.E. and swimming lessons – children must be able to remove their own earrings as staff are not allowed to do this. When a child is unable to remove their own earrings then they should come to school without earrings in on P.E. and swimming days.

Getting ready for September

No other jewellery is allowed to be worn for school. This is for your child's own safety.

Nursery children wear their own clothes with a purple sweatshirt. Parents can either buy plain purple sweatshirts or cardigans from supermarkets OR purple sweatshirts or cardigans with the school logo from the school office.

It is essential that all items of school uniform have the child's name inside.

Please check this regularly.

Lost, unnamed clothing is kept as 'lost property' for a term and then it is recycled.

The following items of uniform are available from the school office.

All these items include our logo.

Nursery sweatshirts are purple, all uniform sold for Primary children is navy blue.

When items are not in stock then they can be ordered.

All other items of uniform can be bought at local supermarkets.


