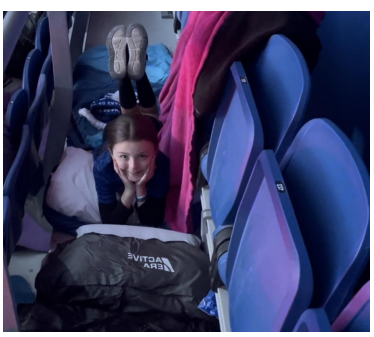
Charity Success for Lottie!

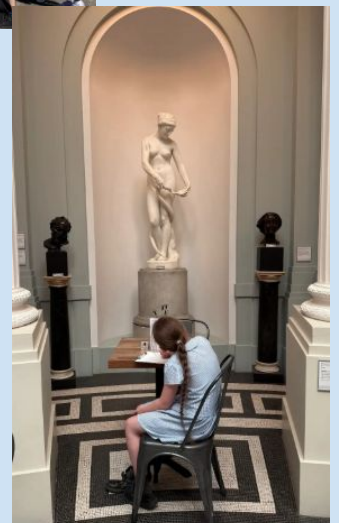
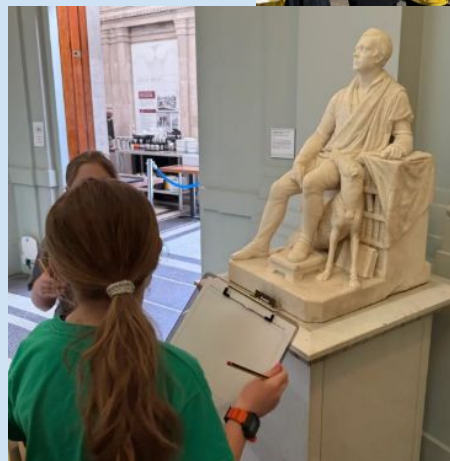
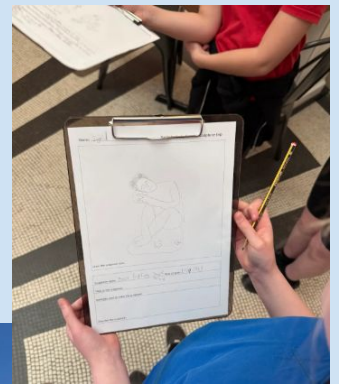
Huge congratulations to our first ever musicians of the month! Each month, we will be celebrating children within school for their outstanding effort and dedication in music lessons.
