Homework:



- Atom Prime (any issues with logins, please let me know).
- Timestable Rockstars: Please use as regularly as possible. It will be set as part of homework. Timestables feature
 heavily in the maths curriculum and knowledge of tables links strongly to self-esteem in maths. Please help your
 child as much as you can to master their tables.
- Regular reading at home.
- Spellings: These will be based on the following week's words so that your child is exposed to them in advance. Please learn the statutory words on the class webpage throughout the year on top of these. Some children in may have bespoke spellings linked to intervention/support work in school instead.
- Literacy Gold
- Later on in the year there will be the opportunity to purchase some CGP revision books for homework.
- Possibly projects at times.

Reading Books



- Children have access to a range of books in the classroom as well as the library in school.
- Accelerated reader: your child will continue to read books in school at their ZPD level.
- Please encourage your child to read at home as much as possible. Set a challenge e.g. 10, 20, 50 etc pages in a sitting.
- Please try and engage in discussions with your child about what they are reading.
- Keep reading own books/magazines/comics etc at home as well(please don't worry about ZPDs here).
- Encourage a breadth of genre within both fiction and non-fiction.

What if my child finds reading tricky?



- Remember, your child may be exhausted from a day at school, so find a time that works for your child and please try not to compare with others.
- Audio books of the book your child is currently reading so that they can follow along at the same time.
- Spend time reading stories to your child, whether that be picture books, chapter books, non-fiction books. When they listen to you read, it will be making such a huge difference to their vocabulary acquisition and imagination.
- Dyslexia friendly books published by e.g. Barrington Stoke are great!
