Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

Today, you will receive notification of the part or character your child(ren) will be playing in our Christmas performance. We are very excited to share our production of *"Lights, Camel, Action!"* with you on **Tuesday 9th December 2025**.

To support you in preparing costumes/outfits, we've put together some suggested ideas below. Please send your child's costume to school in a **named carrier bag on Monday 1st December 2025**.

If you have any questions or concerns about costumes, or if sourcing items may be difficult, please don't hesitate to speak to your child's class teacher - we're happy to help.

Costume Suggestions:

Hosts: Smart outfits such as suits or glamorous long dresses (add a little sparkle if possible).

Voiceovers: Smart clothing (black trousers/skirt and white shirt would be ideal) and a pretend microphone or headset.

Floor Managers: Sparkly or "showbiz" smart clothes - sequins, waistcoats, or bright colours would work well.

Donkey: A donkey costume, or grey/brown clothes with a tail and ears (headband ears are perfect).

Innkeepers: Smart or neat clothing - a waistcoat, shirt and trousers/skirt would work well.

Innkeeper's Wife: A plain top, long skirt and sandals or flats; an apron or headscarf can be added.

Caesar: Roman-style robes or a white sheet worn toga-style, with a draped sash, sandals, and a headpiece/crown.

Townspople/Nazareth Husband/Nazareth Wife: Simple, plain-coloured or checked shirts, neckerchiefs, and plain trousers or long skirts. A shawl or headscarf can complete the look.

Mary and Joseph: Traditional nativity costumes (available in most supermarkets or online), or plain robes and head coverings.

Camels: Camel costumes, or brown/tan tops and trousers with a simple tail and headband ears/humps made from fabric or paper.

Wise Men: Traditional kings' costumes with colourful robes, crowns, and accessories (jewels, boxes, etc.).

Angels (including Gabriel): White robes or dresses with wings and halos. White tutus or ballet-style outfits are also perfect.

Shepherds: White tops and trousers decorated with ribbons (for a Morris-dancer effect due to the nature of the role/performance) with tea-towel headdresses instead of hats.

Sheep: Sheep costumes/fluffy white costumes, or white tops and leggings/trousers with a tail and headband ears.

Star: A gold or silver star costume, or gold/silver clothing with sparkly "disco" accessories and sunglasses for extra fun!
