


## **English**

- English lessons will take place as a whole class
  - -Guided Reading
  - -Writing



- We will be teaching fiction, non fiction and poetry throughout the year focusing on the specific features of the texts.
- We will continue to use the 'Talk for Writing' strategies



- Whole class guided reading using carefully selected texts, as well as continuing with their independent reading.
- · RWI spelling scheme





## Maths



- Following White Rose scheme mastery approach
- Whole class maths lessons
- Children will become increasingly fluent with the four operations, including number facts and place value.
- They will be learning their ALL of their times tables and the related division facts. In order to prepare them for the year 4 times table check, the children will do daily times table practise.
- Multiplication check: is statutory for all year 4 pupils across the country. There is no pass mark.
- · Units of learning such as time, measurement, shape and data.





- Targets match the latest curriculum making sure children are learning the right skills at the right time.
- Step-by-step approach each half term focuses on one clear target, helping children build confidence steadily.
- Personalised support more time for pupils to receive targeted support
- Feedback to parents so you know exactly how to help at home.
- Focus on confidence, not competition removing the pressure of comparison helps children enjoy maths and remove maths anxiety.

KQ: How did the Egyptians lay the foundations for a modern society?

Children will learn about the Egyptians in History and link this to their English lessons through key text, Ma'at's Feather.


#### Life around Europe

KQ: Where is the coolest place to visit in Europe?


Children will learn about Europe and the features of the different countries/landmarks.

#### SPANISH

These groups are fluid and can change weekly.

Children may be in those interventions weekly or just for a one off session if they needed extra support with a certain topic.


These interventions are a great benefit to the children's learning as they build confidence and knowledge in a smaller setting ready to apply this to their class learning.



## Oracy

Oracy is at the centre of our pedagogy and our teaching at Pinner Wood.

In Year 4, the children will continue to develop their oracy skills building on what they have learnt in year 3.

## Home Reading




- Children will have a home reading book that we expect children to change regularly in school week.
- Your child will receive a reading record book where they should comment on the book they have read and finished before changing it.
- Children should read their home reading book daily for around 10 minutes minimum to build fluency.
- Please continue to support your child with their reading by questioning them and encouraging them to think about the text/use the text to develop their vocabulary etc.
- Library is once every 2 weeks. Children will choose 2 books; a fiction and non-fiction text.

#### Weekly Newsletter



- The weekly newsletter will continue in Year 4.
- This will keep you informed of the weeks learning and any other information for that week.
- This will be sent via seesaw each Friday.

## Classroom Organisation



Stationery

Your child will have everything they need at school (pencils, rubbers, rulers etc.) If they are awarded a pen licence they may bring in a BLUE ink pen. The children can also bring a small pencil case for colours etc.

#### Bags

Your child may bring in a SMALL bag for the day. They will only need space for their reading book, water bottle and snack. Please avoid large bags as they will have limited space to store these.



#### Water Bottles and Snack

Please ensure your child brings a bottle of water to school every day (named). This needs to be in addition to any drink in packed lunches.



 Children can bring fruit or vegetables to eat at morning break as this is not provided in Key Stage 2.

## The School Day

The year 3/4 doors will open 8:40am but in Year 4 the children are expected to come up to the classrooms independently at the beginning of the day.

At 3:10pm, the children will be brought down by the teacher to the Year 3/4 door where you can collect them.

#### Key Stage 2 Uniform


- Dark charcoal grey trousers, shorts, skirts or pinafores, green and white small checked dress
- · An official Pinner Wood School knitted jumper or cardigan
- A plain white shirt and a school tie
- They may wear wrist watches and stud earrings but no other jewellery, make up or nail varnish. Earrings and watches to be removed for P.E.
- On the days the children have PE they should come to school wearing their PE kit. This includes:
- Black shorts or a tracksuit bottoms, trainers,
- A Pinner Wood logo P.E shirt and jumper in the child's house colour
- On the days children have a sports club, they are to bring their kit into school and get changed before their club starts.

## Rewards



- As with Year 3, children will be awarded house point for good work, behaviour and effort.
- In Year 4, these will continue to be added together to earn gold stars. Children need 125 house points for one gold star.
- These are awarded in assembly and can be worn on ties or cardigans/jumpers with pride.
- Weekly certificates continue to be awarded in Key Stage 2.
   Children can also earn Pen Licences.
- Children will also be awarded values stickers in which they try to collect all values for their values passport.

## Support your Child

#### How to help your child...

- Ensure that they continue to read regularly.
- Continue to practise the times tables and number bonds.
- Help them learn the Year 3 and 4 common exception words. These can be found on the internet.
- Continue to encourage your child's sense of curiosity e.g. visiting places
  of interest, baking, sports etc.
- Visit any learning opportunities linked to our topics or begin to develop some understanding.



## Attendance - Procedures

- Absence: please report their absence by 8:30 am either by email to attendance@pinnerwood.com or by leaving a message on 02088682468 (option 1)
- If your child has not been accounted for by 9:00 am when the register has been taken, they will be marked as absent.
- If there has been no contact by 11am it will marked as an unauthorised absence. This can be subject to change if evidence can be provided.

#### Attendance - Fines

#### New national framework:

required to consider a fine when a child has missed 10 or more sessions (5 days) for unauthorised reasons.

#### (A morning and afternoon would be considered as 2 sessions)

- The fine will be £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days.
- If a parent receives a second fine for the same child within any three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160.
- Fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three year period.
   Once this limit has been reached, other action like a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.
- If you're prosecuted and attend court, you could get a fine of up to £2,500.





## Safeguarding

- Pinner Wood School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment.
- All staff receive annual Child Protection and Safeguarding refresher training and are aware of the procedures for passing on concerns within school.
