*This half term, our topic is the Anglo-Saxons and we will be focusing our learning in all subjects around the key question
How did the Anglo-Saxons shape Britain?*

Here is a breakdown of the skills and knowledge to be covered in each subject through this topic:

English:

Key text:

- The Breadwinner by Deborah Ellis

Science:
