Here is an outline of the curriculum coverage for the second half of Spring term.

Here is a breakdown of the skills and knowledge to be covered in each subject through this topic:

English:

Key skills:

This half term we will study the famous author Roald Dahl through these genres:

- Information texts
- Letter Writing
- Narrative – adventure stories

We will read The Twits, The Enormous Crocodile and lots of different information fact-files about Roald Dahl.

Maths:

Key topics:

- Multiplication and Division
- Length
- Mass and Temperature

Science:

In Science we will learn how habitats around the world live and survive in nature.

Computing: Video Creation. We will be learning how to use iMovie and the green screen to make a video full of facts all about Zambia.

Geography: We will study human and physical features of a village in Zambia, comparing it to London. We will look at the animals that live there; how they use rivers and prepare food as well as lots of other fun facts!

RE: On RE day our focus will be Christianity, with the key question: Why is the cross important to Christians?

DT: We will explore African patterns through papier Mache and printing.

PE: Team Building

We will be learning to work as a team and learning the importance of communication.
