Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you all had an enjoyable and restful half term. We are hoping that, as we move into Spring, we will have lots of lovely weather ahead of us so that we can enjoy the outdoor space in drier weather!

Our new big question for this term is, 'I wonder how things grow?' and through this, we will be learning about the growing process for both plants and animals, looking at the life cycles of beans, seeds including sunflowers, fruit and vegetables, and of chicks, butterflies and frogs. We will be planting our own seeds and tending to our allotment, observing how they grow and recording our findings. If the children would like to plant any of their own seeds from home, they are more than welcome to bring them in.

Forest School

Reading and Writing

We will continue to learn new level 3 sounds over the next 4 weeks and will then spend time reinforcing these to ensure the children are confident recognising and applying the sounds in their reading and writing. As previously mentioned, children often find it trickier to remember and apply the digraphs and trigraphs so please ensure you are practicing them at home each day. Please continue to read each day and make a comment in their book, it is important that children reread books to develop their sight vocabulary, fluency, expression and understanding of each text. We will only change books if we can see that they have been read at home. Do remember that you have access to a range of books and games via your Twinkl home log in. If you need a reminder of your login details then do please let us know.

Maths

Last term, the children showed brilliant understanding of partitioning numbers and are becoming more confident to add and subtract. We will be continuing to build our skills as we focus on addition and

subtraction for totals to 7 and 8. This will further reinforce the mathematical language introduced last term.





A few housekeeping things and reminders:
