The coloured plastic should ensure the designs last for many, many years. We have used the funds generously provided by our FRIENDS (for the two hop-scotch patterns and the two zebra crossings) and funds from other sources, to enrich playtimes and provide a vibrant space for outdoor play. Oracy project

With the announcement of the new National Curriculum last month, and the immerging importance of oracy for children, we are pleased to once again promote the "Look Who's Talking" project. Full details are in the poster below.

Chocolate

As part of our science and DT work this term oak class have made their own chocolate bars. All the children researched the different types of chocolate bars available, tasted different ones (yum!) and designed and made their own chocolate bars. We also researched, designed and created our own wrappers.





We are a nut free school

Children who suffer from nut allergies can develop a severe, potentially life-threatening allergic reaction. If someone has a nut allergy it is not just eating nuts that can cause a severe reaction, just being touched on the skin or smelling the breath of someone who has had nuts or a product containing nuts can trigger anaphylactic shock (which can cause breathing and swallowing difficulties).

First aid staff in the school are trained to use the Epi-pens (an injection of adrenalin) which is required immediately if this happens. We cannot have nuts in school in any form. So please can we ask that you have no nut products in the lunch boxes or brought into the school as treats.

For example:

- Peanut butter sandwiches
- Chocolate spreads
- Cereal bars
- Some granola bars
- Cakes that contain nuts
- Biscuits / Cookies that contain nuts
- Peanut butter cakes
- Some Asian food, including satay
- Sauces that contain nuts

This list is not exhaustive, so please check the packaging of products closely.

We appreciate that this is an additional thing to check, and we know that you recognise the importance of it. We do have to insist we are a nut free school. I know if this was your child you would expect that we all help, especially as it is a life-threatening condition. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to speak to a member of staff.

Christmas Countdown

A quick word about school uniform and the Christmas period. Unless detailed differently below, school uniform is expected. The exceptions are...

WHAT IS ORACY AND WHY IS IT SO IMPORTANT?

Oracy is the ability to express ourselves clearly and communicate with others effectively, through spoken language.

By teaching our children to become more effective speakers and listeners, we are all helping to give them the tools they need to better understand themselves, each other and the world around them.

HOW WILL THE COMPETITION WORK?

Your child will get the chance to talk to their class for two minutes, about any subject that they choose and then a 'Star Speaker' will be chosen. Star Speakers from every class will then get to talk in front of the whole school. Those winners will then go on to the next stage and will represent our school in the competition, with lots of other local schools! The grand final will be on 17.04.26, which you can come to, if your child is a representative for our locality.

WHAT CAN YOUR CHILD TALK ABOUT?

Children can talk about <u>absolutely anything</u> that they choose to, for <u>up to two-minutes</u> They can use any props that they wish to, which will help with their talk, but just cannot use any technology, so no Powerpoint slide shows please.

HOW CAN YOU HELP THEM AT HOME?

- First of all, please help them to think about what they would like to talk about. The more interested they are in the subject, the more passionate their talk will be! What are they interested in? What excites them? It might be a toy, their pet, a book, something they have seen on TV, their favourite sports team, something they have learned about from you at home - or anything else! It really can be anything at all!
- * They will need to plan and rehearse their speech, so please listen to them practice and give them lots of encouragement!
- Make sure they are speaking with big voices, nice and clearly, so everyone can hear their talk and learn about their chosen topic.
