Writing Intent

For a child, the ability to communicate in written form underpins all other learning and is a vital step in enabling children to become life-long learners. At St James's we prioritise written literacy as a key skill for all children to secure at a young age. Our writing curriculum aims to be engaging and inspiring, motivating children to write for a variety of purposes, always with their reader in mind. Our text-driven writing curriculum provides children with high quality models for writing and ensures a wide range of reading experiences for all. Our ambitious texts expose children to a wide range of vocabulary as well as being chosen to enrich our curriculum with diversity and representation.

Big ideas in our Writing curriculum

- ✓ Text driven English units
- ✓ 5 Rs – Read and Explore it, Rip it, Rehearse it, Write it, Review and Edit it
- ✓ Writing with purpose and audience: children learn to communicate through their writing for a range of different purposes
- ✓ Writing as a reader: engagement of the reader is at the heart of our writing curriculum and reading and writing are seen as two sides of the same
- ✓ Oracy: children learn to speak their ideas aloud before structuring these into sentences. Talk 4 Writing principles underpin our writing sequences
- ✓ Drama: children gain experiences through use of drama
- ✓ Kinetic Letters: gross and fine motor skills developed from preschool through to Year 6
- ✓ Spelling Fridays – LW and NNS woven through writing sequences and in discrete spelling lessons
