Create a picture of your family/ make a family tree. What special events have you shared together as a family? Go on a 'Signs of Autumn hunt' how is the world changing around us?

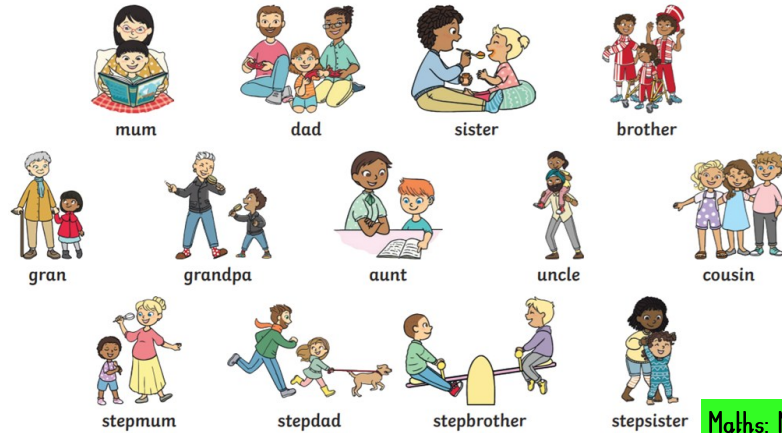


Singing/Rhymes

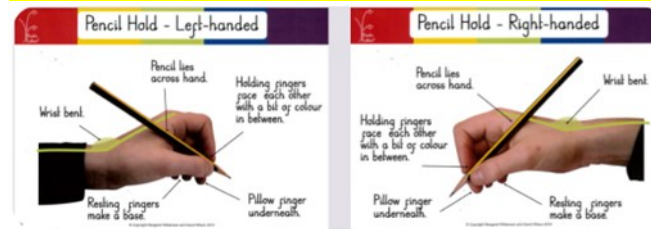

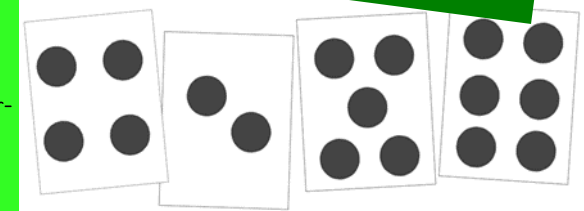
Physical Development: Gross and fine motor skills

Maths: Number and place value to 5.

Subitising: is the rapid, accurate and confident judgements of numbers performed for a small number of items.

Literacy: Reading:

Recapping concepts of print and identifying initial sounds and oral blending

Literacy writing:

Name writing and basic formation is the main focus.

Phonics: We will start learning Phase 2 sounds watch the videos to ensure you are pronouncing them correctly.
