# Reminders: School Meals and Club Bookings via Scopay

Please remember to order your child's meals on Scopay. The current menu will remain the same until Christmas, so no changes are expected until then.

Breakfast Club and After School Club can also be booked via Scopay. Please note that there is no booking lock, so you can make or amend bookings at any time.



### GP and dental appointments

Where possible, please arrange GP and dental appointments outside of school hours. We understand this isn't always feasible, but avoiding disruption to the school day helps maintain consistent learning.

The Department for Education reports that medical and dental appointments are a leading cause of authorised absences in UK schools. Even short absences can impact progress, especially in core subjects.

If an appointment during the school day is unavoidable, please inform the school in advance and provide appointment evidence (e.g. a confirmation text or letter).

Thank you for your support in helping us prioritise your child's education.

### Parking and Road Safety Outside School

We have recently received several reports from local residents and members of our school community regarding inconsiderate and unsafe parking, including cars being parked across residents' driveways during drop-off and pick-up times. This is not acceptable.

As a school, we are part of a wider community, and we ask all parents and carers to be respectful of our neighbours at all times. Blocking driveways or restricting access causes unnecessary stress and frustration and reflects poorly on our school community.

Over the summer holidays, you may have noticed that Cheshire East Council has introduced additional yellow zig-zag and double yellow lines outside school. We fully support this decision, as it has been made with the safety of our pupils as the top priority.

The markings are there to:

- · Keep visibility clear for children and families crossing the road
- Allow safe access for emergency vehicles
- Prevent congestion and reduce risk of accidents during busy times

This issue is not new, and unfortunately, it has been a long-standing concern. We must all take collective responsibility to ensure the safety of every child and adult in our community. Inconsiderate parking will not be tolerated.

If you witness unsafe or illegal parking outside the school, we urge you to: Report it to the non-emergency police on 101

By logging these incidents, we can build a clearer picture to support requests for increased traffic enforcement, better signage, and improved road safety measures.

### PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE ARE CHANGING!

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force on 19 August 2024.

#### Penalty Notices will be issued for

Term time leave: Penalty Notice fines will be issued for term time leave of 5 or more consecutive days.

10 Sessions of Unauthorised absence in a rolling 10 week period: A Penalty Notices may be considered when there have been 10 sessions of unauthorised absences in a 10 week period.

However, we retain the discretion to issue a Penalty Notice before the threshold is met. For example, where parents are deliberately avoiding the national threshold by taking several term time holidays below the above thresholds.

#### Per Parent/Per Child

Penalty Notice fines will continue to be issued per parent per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

#### First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular school attendance the fine will be charged at:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days of the issue, reducing to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

(Unpaid penalty notices may result in a parental prosecution)

#### Second Offence

Where it is deemed appropriate to issue a second penalty notice to the same parent for the same pupil within 3 years of the first penalty notice, for either term time leave or irregular attendance the second penalty notice will be charged at:

£160 if paid within 28 days. (Unpaid penalty notices may result in a parental prosecution)

#### Third Offence

On the third time that an offence is committed within 3 years of the first penalty notice for either a term time leave or irregular attendance a penalty notice will not be issued. The case may proceed to Parental Prosecution under the Single Justice Procedure. If found guilty of the offence of 'Failure to send a child to school' the Magistrates can impose a fine up to £1000 or legal proceedings under Section444 (1a) can include a fine of up to £2500.

#### Seesaw

Seesaw is the application that we use within school to document your child's learning journey. If you require further information regarding this please see below. SeeSaw Info for Families.

It might help you to print out the QR code and keep this as once you log out of your child's account you will need the code to log back in again. If you are having difficulties please see your child's class teacher.

## BALLET AND CREATIVE DANCE CLASS



Creative Dance for Early Years is an innovative dance syllabus, created by Rambert Grades. Each dance class will take the children on an imaginative journey with endless themes.
