

Dear parents and carers,

We have recently reviewed our rewards system with a key focus being to ensure that rewards are consistent, meaningful and quantifiable across all year groups.

We are pleased to introduce **Quinta Quests**, our new whole-school approach that will replace **Above and Beyonds** and **Quinta Stars**.

Children will work towards a series of 'quests' each term - all linked to our four key drivers of 'Everyday Excellence', 'Authentic Care', 'Independence', and 'Opportunity'. Completing the full set of quests in a term will earn them a **bronze, silver or gold award** (autumn, spring, summer term).



- Bronze is awarded the first term they achieve all quests.
- Silver is awarded the second term they do this.
- Gold is awarded the third term they do this.

This year, as we are launching the system in the spring term, all children will start by working towards **silver level**. This means children may achieve silver in spring then work towards gold in summer. Alternatively, if they do not achieve silver in spring, they could do so in the summer term. These will be awarded to children on a termly basis.

What are the quests?

Everyday Excellence

- Behaviour is consistently excellent across the term (with adjustments in place for children who need them).
- Attendance of 95% or above (exceptional circumstances will be considered).
- High-quality presentation in work across the curriculum.

Authentic Care

- Taking pride in their classroom and wider school environment.
- Being recognised for kindness in class or in assemblies.

Opportunity

- Taking on a leadership or volunteering role in class or across school.
- Completing **10 home scrapbook activities each term***.

Independence

- All homework completed weekly, including reading diaries being returned.
- Being recognised for effort in class or in assemblies.

*We really enjoyed looking through the scrapbooks children created over the summer. These activities help build children's confidence, spark their interests and encourage them to explore new experiences outside of school. They sit alongside the wonderful opportunities children already take part in at school such as sports, drama, trips, experience mornings and STOP days, and help strengthen their overall personal development.









Children will have a set list of scrapbook quests. They can choose the activities they are most interested in and need to complete **10 quests each term** to meet the "Opportunity" part of their **Quinta Quest award each term**. Children record their chosen activities in their scrapbooks and teachers will check completed quests on a given date at the end of each term.
