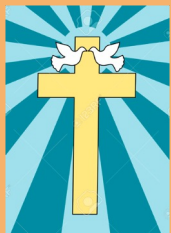
What about the wet and cold weather for Forest School?

Science

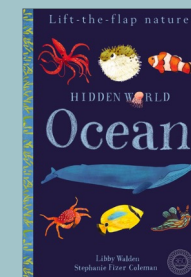
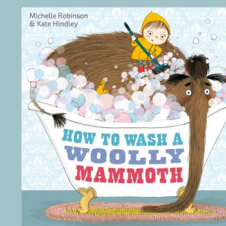

Geography

Our key questions this term are "Where in the world do I live? and "How is our weather different to countries far away?" Children will develop their map skills and compare our weather to different countries around the world.

History
