

Reception Learning Narrative - Summer 2023

Communication & Language

This term we will be continuing to develop our spoken language by having conversations and sharing our ideas with others. We will be learning new vocabulary such as wild and captivity, ocean and seashore. Through the use of stories and non-fiction books the children will have lots of opportunities to explore new thinking and language. We will continue to build up our known poems, building on ones we have learnt already such as 'A cup of tea' and 'A basket full of apples'

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

We will be developing growing independence by encouraging the children to put on sunhats and reminding the children to drink plenty of water if the weather is warm. By working together, children will continue to learn to take turns, share and how to resolve issues with friends. Phonics - This term we will be looking at longer words contain digraphs and trigraphs along with new tricky words. We will be building on the fluency of reading a words. Allowing the children to focus on using prosody when reading a sentence. Also comprehend what the sentence is telling the child.

We will consider your child's needs and interests to plan challenging and enjoyable activities and experiences.

There are also three **characteristics of effective teaching and learning**:

- · Playing and exploring
- Active learning
- Creating and thinking critically

These tell us about *how each child learns* not *what* they are learning



Understanding the World

We will be looking at our local geography and understanding how to draw a map. With the change of season, we will learn how to keep ourselves healthy and safe.



The Wonder of Maths

This term we will continue to explore the early number system to secure firm foundations in the development of good number sense for all children.

The areas we will be exploring are: Subitising - knowing how many objects there are without the need to count them. Counting, Cardinality - how many of something there is in a set, Ordinality - the position of something in list e.g 2nd, 5th etc, Composition of number - how numbers are made up of other numbers e.g 7 is 5 + 2, Comparison - which numbers are larger, smaller or the same.
