The school day

The main school gates open at 8:20am and children need to be in school, ready to learn by 8:30 am. Children arriving late will need to register at the school office. School finishes at 3:00 pm. Attendance

High attendance at school is not just valuable, it's essential. It gives children the best possible chance of developing secure friendships, feeling safe, building on prior learning and succeeding academically. There is a proven link between high attendance and doing well at school. At St Martins we promote the importance of high attendance in our weekly celebration assembly, awarding 'Attendance Bear' to the class with the highest attendance for that week.

As a school we strive for a goal of 100% attendance however we do recognise that there will be times when children are not well enough to be in school. Learning Narrative

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Reading

We will be beginning to teach our phonics programme next week which forms the foundation on which children will build their reading and writing skills. Children will be given their first school reading book to go home on Wednesday 1st October. We would like to invite you to a “**Foundations for Learning**” information session on **Wednesday 1st October at 2.30pm** to explain to you how we teach reading at school and explain how your role in hearing your child read at home will work. We will also offer guidance with how you can support your child's early reading, mark-making and mathematics learning at home. (You can keep bookbags at home until Wednesday 1st October.) As well as reading at home, occasionally we may send home activities which will promote consolidation of learning in other subjects too.

P.E

Your child will have PE on Tuesdays. In Reception, the children **do not** need a PE kit.

Forest school

The forest session for Chicks and Ducklings will be every Friday morning. Forest School will begin on Friday 12th of September and Mr Bush will be sending out further details on School Spider. Children will need to **come to school wearing their forest clothes** (long sleeved top and trousers). Please make sure that they also come to school with a suitable waterproof coat and that they either bring wellies or have a pair stored at school. Please provide a change of clothes for your child, should they need to get changed after the forest.

Belongings & Uniform

Please ensure that all personal items are labelled clearly. As the children remove their shoes in the classroom please also name shoes clearly as they are very easily mixed up! Even with the best intentions, children do lose things - having them named means that items can find their way back to the correct owner.

Water Bottles and Snacks

We come together for a mid-morning snack and drink.

Children are provided with a piece of fruit each day. Therefore **snacks are not required from home**. This also means that we are able to keep our children safe who have allergies. As you can imagine spillages happen so we would really appreciate it if your child has only water in their bottle.
