How we identify if a child needs additional support

Through careful monitoring and observation. Pupil progress meetings, teacher assessments, meetings with parents/carers, pupil voice and learning walks.

How we will consult parents & children & involve them in their education

We meet with parents on a regular basis but we also have strong links with families which allows us to be open about pupil progress and need.

How we will assess & review pupils with SEND progress towards outcomes

Through pupil progress meetings, bespoke SEND assessments for individual children, meetings with parents and staff, involving outside agencies, SLT progress meetings

How we will support children in moving between phases of education & / or preparing for adulthood

Through an effective transition program such as: extra transition days, pupil meetings, video calls with staff and parents

Our approach to teaching children with SEND & how we adapt the curriculum & learning environment for pupils with SEND

By offering a curriculum that all children can access on their own level, through careful adaptations and by offering equal opportunities to all-without prejudice or discrimination.

How we train our staff who provide support to pupils with SEND & the existing expertise they have

Staff are offered regular training that may be specific to the needs of an individual child.

How we evaluate the effectiveness of the provision made for pupils with SEND

Through regular Pupil Centred Planning meetings, pupil progress meetings, parents evenings, consultation with outside agencies, SEND Link governor meetings.

How we encourage & enable pupils with SEND to engage with activities available to pupils with no SEND requirement
Through modelling by staff of high expectations and how to embrace diversity and encourage inclusivity throughout the school
